## Parents' Bulletin

#### **Dear Parents**

Following on from our really strong A Level results in the summer we had a fantastic 6<sup>th</sup> Form Open Evening yesterday, where a record number of families attended to find out what our 6<sup>th</sup> Form has to offer.

The feedback from parents, students and staff has been extremely positive – more from Mr Mather our Head of Sixth Form later in this bulletin.

#### **Target Setting**

Over the next few weeks students in all year groups will be discussing their targets for the year (in Yr 7,8 and 9) or course (Yr 10,11,12 and 13), with their subject teachers. All targets are created by using prior attainment data and base line testing to predict what a student could achieve at the end of the year or course (in the case of GCSE and A Level)

We use a system devised by the Fisher Family Trust (FFT) to predict the possible outcomes in each subject. We then set the targets based on an estimate of what the top 20% of children with a particular intake profile could achieve in each subject. The targets are deliberately designed to be challenging to encourage students to push themselves to do the very best they can.

Our progress review cycle begins after half term. All details of when you will receive your child's progress review sheet and can meet with subject teachers is detailed below.

Year 9 is a little later to co-inside with the options process which starts after Christmas – more details about this later in the term.

#### **Sixth Form Open Evening**

We were delighted to welcome over 160 families to our Sixth Form Open Evening last night, including over 30 from other local schools, all of whom were keen to find out more about 'The Yateley Offer'.

The reports that I have had back, show that plenty of great conversations went on and I hope that everyone found out what they wanted to know. Of course, if you have questions following the evening, or stemming from visits to other colleges, please do hesitate get in touch.

One of the questions that I was asked most was "Whether or not Yateley still offers students the chance to study 4 AS levels?"....the answer is that we most certainly do!. We still believe that 4 subjects at AS level is the best route, even if other colleges are moving away from that.

The reality is that this move is more about college cost cutting than education, however it is dressed up by college principals. Four subjects give flexibility and a higher points haul at the end of it all, which is important. Four are also a perfectly manageable work load for most students. Of course if students would rather study three, we are ok with that too, so long as they understand that they are with those subjects through thick and thin.

The second most frequent question was about subject choices. "Can you swap subjects after you have submitted your application?"....of course you can!. Students often change their minds, it's only natural as they go through Year 11 and then the exams process.

In fact we still have swaps going on into early September of Year 12. The initial choices really give a start point and are something we will explore with students when we meet with them to talk about their subjects in January.


