# Parents' Bulletin

## **Dear Parents**

#### **Teacher Shortages**

I have written in the past about teacher shortages. These are affecting all schools – private as well as maintained. Whenever a teacher leaves or is ill for the long term, we do our absolute best to make sure that the education of our students does not suffer. While we are mostly fully staffed, we have three members of staff on long term sick leave and have not recruited yet for two posts, one vacant since January and the other since Easter.

We adopt a number of strategies. We of course try to employ the best cover teachers we can. Failing specialist cover teachers we swap teachers about so that any one class has a specialist teacher for at least part of the time and we try and focus on examination classes as a priority. If we can draft in capable teaches for at least some of the affected lessons, we do so. We have also doubled up two classes, with one teacher (+support) so that students have access to their specialist knowledge. All of these measures place an extra strain on those specialist teachers remaining – they have to set work for their absent colleagues, deal with the issues that inevitably arise when cover teachers, unused to our systems, take over a class and often, mark important pieces of work for their absent colleagues.

All parents of students affected by these absences will want reassurance about their child's education under these circumstances and we understand this and would want to offer this. However, to do this on an individual basis simply adds to the stress that remaining specialists are already under.

Please accept our assurances that we are doing all that we can under the circumstances.

We have met with the view that somehow we have failed in not supplying appropriate teachers as and when, as if such disapproval will magic up the right teachers. Googling 'teacher shortages' will provide dozens of articles such as the one below and perhaps create a little more understanding that we are one of many schools suffering the outcomes of forces, unfortunately, beyond our control. An email or letter to the DfE or relevant MP would be much more useful.

- Ski lift pass



If you have had your bike stolen, you can enter the bike details on this site and any bike put up for sale on Gumtree or eBay which matches the details given will be emailed to you. Over the last year, more than 1000 stolen bikes have been identified.

The website also has a section to check bike serial numbers (for those thinking of buying to check if stolen) and to report stolen bikes.

#### The Water Safety Code

During the school holidays, and in particular in hot weather, increasing numbers of children put themselves at risk of drowning. To keep yourself safe, when you are in, on or beside water, always follow the Water Safety Code.

Spot the dangers! Water may look safe, but it can be dangerous. Learn to spot dangers and keep away from them. You may swim well in a warm indoor pool, but that does not mean you will be able to swim in cold water.

The dangers of water include:

- Very cold temperatures and hidden currents
- It can be deep and it is difficult to estimate depth
- There may be hidden rubbish like shopping trolleys or broken glass and it can be difficult to get out (steep slimy banks)
- No lifeguards and water pollution may make you ill
