Budget Cuts

The teaching unions – most of them - have got together to promote a campaign to raise awareness of the cuts to education budgets. While the number of students of school age is rising and so the amount spent on education is too, there is no increase in per pupil funding. This means no funding to cover inflation, the (small) increase in teachers' pay each year, the increase in NI and pension contributions and other assorted extras.

The unions estimate that 99% of schools will have a funding cut. Primary schools will lose an average of £103,754 by 2020 and secondary schools £470,433. The figures they have worked out for Yateley School show a loss of £449,665 by 2019, the equivalent of 13 teachers and schools are at the point where they can only really save that sort of money by getting rid of teachers.

That's one way of managing the teacher shortage. Is that the sort of educational system you want for your children?

GCSEpod

Our students, mainly in Year 11, have downloaded or streamed 25,000 of the revision pods. We are apparently, says gcsepod "a member of a very exclusive club". Although they don't say how exclusive which makes it sound like insincere hyperbole, it is worth remembering that in April, we exceeded the average number watched for a school of our size by over 13,000.

So, maybe we are exclusive and congratulations to our hardworking Year 11 students who are pulling out all the stops.

And, because we are so fantastic, gcsepod is sending us a framed certificate – we don't even have to download our own.

Examinations

The exams have started in earnest now and the attitude and attendance of Year 11 have been excellent.

We do insist on proper school uniform and we are proud of our students who wouldn't think of behaving otherwise. A few do but we will send them away to get properly dressed and this is all unnecessary upset at an important time.


