### **Staff for September**

Moving teaching jobs is an odd business. There are theoretically only 3 times in a year that a teacher can leave and these are at the end of a term and half a term's notice is required. Thus the weeks leading up to half term can be frantic as schools scramble to interview and appoint teachers so that, if they already have a job, they can resign in time. A Headteacher's worst nightmare is late resignations just before half term, which mean that they either have to look at teachers not in jobs – some of whom are not in a job for good reasons – or wait a term and make do in the meantime,

Fortunately this did not happen to us and we are pleased to say that, after a great deal of effort and any number of interviews, we have made excellent appointments for September. We are looking now for just one teacher and we will then be fully staffed. We have three months to find the right one.





## Helping Year 10 students approaching key decisions

Following on from the opportunity to secure work experience in the Summer term, all students in this year group will soon be faced with some important, and sometimes challenging, choices relating to college and apprenticeship options.

Making these choices will be significantly easier if students have a career in mind for their future.

**It is for this reason that students with no or no definite career plans are recommended to request a careers interview as soon as possible.**

A careers interview is an informal meeting with a qualified, impartial adviser designed to help young people with decisions around choosing college options, apprenticeships and careers.

Prior to their careers interview it is suggested that students complete a **careers questionnaire** online. Students who know their login details can access to the Kudos questionnaire directly (<https://kudos.cascaid.co.uk/#/>) or approach the school if they do not know their details. Alternatively <http://www.plotr.co.uk/game/> offers a similar facility.

### Children's career choices fixed by gender as early as age 4

The gender divide is as strong at age 4 as it is at 14 when it comes to children's career choices, a major new study has revealed.

The figures, based on the decisions of hundreds of thousands of children, reveal that gender stereotypes about potential career choices are firmly in place well before the teenage years and then remain.

The data raises significant questions about the impact of high-profile interventions designed to encourage girls to study Stem subjects and consider careers in engineering. One teachers' leader warned this week that society had "gone backwards" on tackling the gender divide.

## Community Safety News

### Heathland fire safety

The past few months have seen an increase in heathland and wild fires across the Safer North Hampshire area. Hampshire Fire & Rescue Service offer the following safety advice:



- Do not discard cigarettes on the ground—dispose of smoking material properly and ensure they are fully extinguished.
- Clear away any bottles and glasses to avoid them magnifying the sun.
- Take extra care if using a barbecue, and do not dispose of the remains in a bin unless it is completely cooled.
- Talk to young people about the danger of playing with and lighting fires.
- Report any information about illegal fire-setting activities and those responsible.

If you see a fire:

- Call 999 immediately.
- Don't attempt to tackle fires that can't be put out with a bucket of water.
- Give a map reference, if possible, or alternatively give a landmark such as a farm or pub.
- Estimate the size of the area on fire.
- Describe the type of terrain (grass, bracken, forest, heathland).
- Do not attempt to film or take pictures which may put you at risk.
