Dear Parents

The panels are not the same, meeting all building regulations. The building is not residential, has two sets of stairs and our response to any automatic alarm is flight, not remain. We are confident that the rapid evacuation times we record in practices and the automatic fire detection systems will ensure the safety of all of our students.


