Sporting success

As usual, we sent a large team to the Junior Track and Field District Championships last week. Our Year 7 boys came second overall, our Year 8 boys came third, Year 7 girls sixth and our Year 8 girls fourth.

Harry Ware in 7DS is the 600m District Champion. Harry is ranked number one in the UK for his age group in 800m and his time of 2:11:7 ranks in the top 20 fastest times for under 13s since records began. He is number 2 in the 1500m and is pushing to be number 1 in a competition in Watford next Wednesday.

To add to this he is not surprisingly current 800m Hampshire champion but less expected are his achievements in being the 200m U14 Hampshire champion, 100m Hampshire silver medallist as well as cross country District champion, Hampshire cross country Bronze medallist and 7th in the UK pentathlon league. Fantastic achievements, I'm sure you will agree.

Our Year 7 Track Knock out team qualified for the Hampshire games and came second overall. Our Year 8 Basketball team qualified for these games and finished third overall. The highlight of the day was a brilliant 10-8 win over Kings School in Winchester – the organisers noted that our team had the strongest defence of all the teams.

Community Safety News

Picking up on borough's litterers

Cracking down on people who litter in the borough is the focus of the Community Safety Patrol Team, as part of a targeted campaign aimed



at educating and enforcement - talking to the public about the possible repercussions of littering and taking action against those caught dropping rubbish.

Those who are spotted littering will face an on-the-spot fine of £75, and those who refuse to pay could end up with a criminal record and costs of up to £2,500 following a successful prosecution. The borough council has prosecuted 30 people so far at a cost of up £900 a time. The Community Safety Patrol Officers have identified litter hotpots across the borough and are carrying out targeted patrols. Residents are encouraged to support this plight by reporting if they see someone littering. In addition to handing out fines, the officers have been providing advice and education about littering and its consequences, with the aim of preventing further offences.

The campaign builds on the good work of the Notice Your Neighbourhood campaign, which encourages residents to help spot low-level crime in their communities and report issues like graffiti, fly-tipping, and abandoned vehicles.

The campaign is part of the Love your Borough drive which is encouraging people to take pride in the area they live, and take a stand against those who don't respect their local area You can help keep the borough streets clean, and avoid littering fines, by using the waste bins or taking your litter home.
