The Year 5 Activity days were a great success too, with over 379 students attending and engaging in activities such as using Photoshop with their own pictures, in Food Technology they did a ready steady cook pizza, fantastic orienteering in PE learning as much as they could about Columbia and Germany ...to name but a few. We were very pleased to see them all and glad that they had such a fantastic time

## **Work Experience**

We are one of the few secondary schools who still arrange work experience for our students. It is recognised as valuable by students, who in the 2013 guidance were "very positive about the benefits and particularly valued experiencing a real working environment and gaining skills and confidence". We carry out our own Health and Safety screening for potential employers – previously charges between £45.00 and £95.00 were charged by specialist assessors. Sidestepping this was one of the main reasons we could continue.

However, in these times of huge financial pressures, we will have to charge in the future for this work. The charge will be for the new Headteacher to decide, but will be in the region of £20.00 - £25.00 - a very small price to pay for such a valuable experience.
