From the Headteacher...

Dear Parents



I am pleased to bring you encouraging news from your school. Term Two has got well under way and the students are settled very effectively back into their work. This time of year is sometimes described as the 'engine room' of teaching and certainly in examination years, this is when a great deal of the important content will be covered. In the main, this is clearly well understood by the students and they are showing a great deal of maturity, determination and endeavour - with a few timely reminders along the way!

I have been very clear when talking to students that the key to success and a truly great school experience comes from a positive and productive outlook; actively choosing the response they make to everyday challenges. This idea, often called a 'growth mind-set', requires us to believe that the abilities and qualities you are born with can be developed and cultivated through effort, application, experience and practice. With the growth mind-set in place, we see challenging situations as opportunities to learn and grow. When we make a mistake in our reading or writing, we learn from it and improve the next time we come across that word or that expression. When the teacher asks a question, we think about it, and we are happy to explore it together with our classmates to help refine and develop our thinking, leading to greater and deeper understanding. The process helps us to improve. To grow. And even if we don't know the answer right now, if we work at it, listen carefully, and apply ourselves, we will know it soon and the results will be massive. As I have been equally clear with students, whom we are training to be responsible adults - there is a choice and those who actively misuse that choice will face clear consequences...

We have great news from the Sixth Form where we are well into university application season and I am excited to report that we already have 23 offers of places made to Yateley students from universities. These include subjects ranging from Maths to Sociology to Law and even Medical sciences. Even better, some students have received the rare and coveted unconditional offer! This is testament to them clearly demonstrating passion and potential in their subject areas to the extent that universities are desperate to have them; a real achievement. Our Medics and Oxbridge candidates still have a wait to endure but they will get the news soon!

In terms of non-university based careers, we had the pleasure of welcoming local (but global) company BTG Pharmaceuticals in to talk about the higher level apprenticeships as well as representatives from local apprenticeship hubs BCot and FCot to provide advice for our sixth formers about this new and exciting route. It was great to welcome back an ex-Yateley student who is currently studying for an apprenticeship with BTG and was able to explain the benefits of this route to our students. Inspiring stuff indeed! For our current year 11, and year 11 from other schools, our application deadline is the 17th November. We have 85 so far, so if you haven't taken the plunge yet: it's not too late, but be quick!

We are making a determined effort to develop, widen and improve our Social Media output, especially on Twitter. It is a superb way of keeping up to date with many of day to day achievements and successes across the school. As well as the main Twitter account @yateleyschool, you may well be aware of the many subject and House twitter accounts within the school. If you haven't already



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explored this world, can I please encourage you to do so? A full list of these accounts will be published shortly.

May I finally take the opportunity to thank those parents who have taken the time to come and meet me in the two first 'meet the new Head' sessions? I have found the sessions fascinating, instructive and overwhelmingly supportive. If the timings haven't suited (and there is one more session to run), please do not hesitate to contact me at the school. I am keen to hear your views.
