Dear Parents



As the week draws to a close, I would like to thank parents for your immense support in attending the Subject Review Day on Friday 24 November for students in years seven, eleven, twelve and thirteen and the parents' subject review evening for Year Eight students on Thursday 30 November. A really strong turnout and the commitment to working together spoke volumes about the level of support and what we can look to achieve for our young people. Thank you again for giving up your time - I hope it was a positive experience.

I have been fortunate to have begun visits to our partner primary schools. The exceptional work that I've seen and the warmth of the welcome has been brilliant and again a real opportunity as we seek to reenergise the educational partnerships in the Yateley community and aim, where possible, to enable a seamless journey from Reception through to adult life. I have a number of visits still to make, but would like to thank the primary teachers I've seen so far.

We've run a number of highly successful educational trips in the last week, not least of which was taking six students to compete against 15 other schools in Surrey last night at the Geographical Association quiz. There were 15 schools involved and one of our teams came second which was an outstanding achievement! The students involved were: Muaz Zaman, Sam Keys, Tom Branch, Daniel Kennedy, Ben Stevens and Michael Shaw. They were an absolute credit to the Geography team and to the whole school - we are really pleased!

The intensity and pace of work is gradually and consistently increasing for our Year 11s and similarly in the Sixth Form. They all know how important this school year is for them in terms of making the most of every opportunity to consolidate knowledge and practise skills learnt so that come the summer exams, they are in the very best position to achieve their full potential. This can seem quite daunting and so it is often more helpful to view this year as a series of short sprints towards a specific goal, rather than one long and possibly intimidating battle. With that in mind, the forthcoming mock exams should be seen as an opportunity, not a threat. An opportunity, with careful revision and preparation to demonstrate clearly and accurately what has been grasped and to gain a crystal clear picture of precisely what specific areas need further practice and perhaps guidance. There is plenty of useful material online, especially those sites which provide students with the diagnostic tools to really pinpoint those areas for further refinement. Sensible and focused revision alongside the best resource of all - the class teachers, will enable students to make the best possible use of the mocks.

Thank you for your support with uniform over last half term as standards of uniform have been excellent with only a few individual student uniform issues. Now that the weather has become colder pupils are starting to wearing outdoor coats. These coats need to be worn over school jumpers and no hoodies are allowed to be worn. Scarves are advisable too, but must be removed in classrooms.

I am delighted to congratulate Ben Elsey 9PN and Tom Branch 9NS both of whom have recently achieved their Chief Scout's Gold award with 1st Finchampstead Scout group. This is the highest award achievable as a Scout and involved completing nine Challenge badges and at least six activity badges. They have both



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taken part in an overnight cycling expedition as part of the Expedition Challenge award and spent over 20 nights camping and cooking on an open fire for their Outdoor Challenge award.

They have had to show leadership, organisation and communication skills as a Patrol leader to achieve this award which is an amazing achievement.

Well done also to Hope O'Neill 7PS who took part in the British Schools Judo Competition on Saturday 18th November in Wales and with outstanding skill won a Silver medal.

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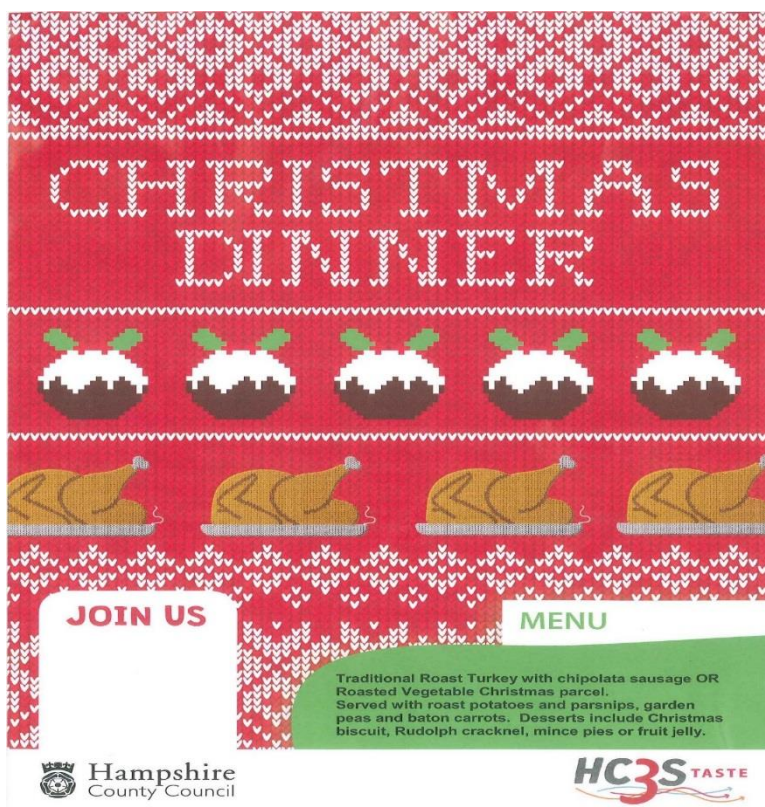
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CHRISTMAS LUNCH – WEDNESDAY 13TH DECEMBER

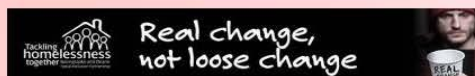
Christmas crime prevention roadshows

In the run up to Christmas, "Operation Stronghold" crime prevention stalls will be held, from 11am to 1pm, at:

23 November	Festival Place, Basingstoke
1 December	Hart Shopping Centre, Fleet
7 December	Wellington Centre, Aldershot
21 December	Princes Mead, Farnborough

You can reduce your chances of becoming a victim of crime in the run up to Christmas by following these tips:

- When shopping, always park cars in a well-lit area, and ensure doors are locked and windows closed.
- Never leave purchases or presents on display in vehicles.
- Do not leave bags unattended while shopping, and ensure purses or wallets are secure at all times. Always shield your PIN.
- At home, do not leave presents on display and ensure cash or gift cards are not left around.
- Make sure windows and doors are locked, and remove keys from sight when leaving the house. Do not leave boxes advertising expensive gadgets outside the house until the bins are emptied – take them to the tip instead!

Pre-drinking campaign in Fleet

We will be working with Hampshire Constabulary to tackle the issue of pre-drinking and associated nuisance in an effort to ensure everyone has a safe and enjoyable evening out in Fleet Town Centre prior to Christmas.



Pre-drinking is where individuals or groups drink to excess before going out for the evening. Once out, they are more likely to drink to further excess, increasing their vulnerability and chances of becoming a victim of crime, or in some rare cases, a perpetrator.

As part of the campaign, we will be attending local sixth form colleges to talk to students about safe levels of drinking and the dangers of pre-drinking. Police will also be carrying out proactive patrols in the town centre in the run up to Christmas, and using powers under section 35 of the Antisocial Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 to disperse any individuals who arrive in the town excessively drunk.

Hart District Council Licensing team would also like to remind visitors to the town centre to ensure they use only properly licensed vehicles and pre-book their vehicle when possible to ensure availability. You can find out more about taxi requirements by visiting www.hart.gov.uk or calling the Licensing team on 01252 622122.

Other ways to stay safe on a night out include: never leaving your drink unattended and not accepting a drink from someone you don't know – if you think your drink has been tampered with, don't drink it and tell a trusted friend or relative immediately. Some bars provide plastic stoppers for bottles which can reduce the risk of your drink being spiked. Remember that you may still be over the alcohol limit the day after a night out.
