Geography - GCSE urban fieldwork, Southampton



Our 4 GCSE classes have successfully completed their urban fieldwork this Southampton. investigated how the quality of life varies between three contrasting areas - Bassett (Rural-urban fringe), Bevois (Inner city) and Bargate (The Central Business District). Students used a variety of methods to test the quality of life in each area: litter environmental counts, quality surveys, decibel readings and questionnaires. We were extremely impressed with the maturity of our

year 10 students whilst they conducted their fieldwork and they can now complete their write ups in class which will prepare them for their exam.

Safe Drive stay alive.

From looking at statistics I know that the most dangerous thing our sixth formers do is to travel in each other's cars; young people account for a high proportion of both serious injuries and fatalities on our roads. So taking the whole sixth form to Safe Drive Stay Alive is one of the most important things that we do. Students watched a hugely powerful mixture of film and personal testimony from both people involved in road safety and victims of accidents. They ranged from police, ambulance and fire & rescue personnel, to an A&E consultant and video from a young driver serving 8 years in prison for causing death by dangerous driving. But the person most students came away thinking about was a mother whose son was killed, aged 21, in a car crash. She described in almost unbearable detail the events of that terrible day and how

her and her family's lives were changed forever. There wasn't a dry eye in the house: both her intense grief and immense courage were plain to see. She was followed by a woman who had received a severe traumatic brain injury in a crash and has been left needing almost full time care. The event really does a great job of showing the wide effect of road traffic accidents. By taking our entire sixth form I hope that we can have a real impact in helping them, as a group to think more about their safety on the roads, both as drivers and passengers. In addition we were given enough phone defenders for every sixth form student: a pouch in which you can put your phone, that blocks their mobile signals and consequently reduces the likelihood of being distracted by the device. We have been handing them out today: please ask to see your son or daughter's one, if they don't have one yet please hassle them to come and collect theirs! We all want them to stay safe out there.










House Points, Behaviour & Conduct: Weekly Update 05.09.18 to 02.11.18
