Year 10 BAE Challenge- STEM

Miss Williams writes to tell us that the Design and Technology Faculty took two teams of Year 10 students to compete at the BAE challenge at BAE Systems in Farnborough this week. The challenge 'Emergency Rescue Mission' was to provide a solution to transport injured civilians in a developing country away from an area hit by an earthquake. The students had to design and build a bridge, as well as a battery powered vehicle, that could travel over the bridge and bring the people to safety. The students worked through the planning, design and build stages providing detailed costings of the materials used. Our students showed fantastic team working skills, produced impressive end products and gave very well prepared presentations to the panel of judges. Whilst our teams didn't win the competition, the judges were very impressed with their submissions and mentioned how well they went about solving the problem.

This was an excellent opportunity for students to bring together skills learnt in all STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) and solve problems in a practical way using the iterative design process. Our students had the opportunity to work with the engineers at BAE throughout the day and were able to find out more about STEM careers and opportunities in design/engineering. It was great to see the students so engaged with the challenge, they showed determination and enthusiasm and an excellent experience was had by all. Thanks to everyone involved.....


Monks, Mosques and Icons






