What skills will I develop?

AO1 -Develop ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources.

- AO4 Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and demonstrates understanding of visual language.

How will I be assessed?

At Key Stage 4 all work produced is coursework and will be assessed using the exam board assessment objectives and assessment criteria

Examination: In January of Yr 11 students will be given their exam paper. The exam consists of three months to develop a project and then two full days to produce a concluding piece.

Three ways that parents/carers can help...

- 1. Talk to your child about their work. Ask them to explain what they are doing and why. Being asked to verbalise their ideas will help them bring clarity to their thinking.
