The Dance department provides 6th form students with a vocational course that provides a range of pathways for further educational study. At Yateley, we offer the Level 3 National Extended Certificate in Performing Arts. This is equivalent to 1 A level. We specialise as a Dance pathway for those students who are keen to study a practical course and enjoy performing and choreography, as well as analysing dance practitioners. BTEC qualifications are valued by Higher Education providers and employers. Many students go onto study at specialist dance and drama colleges or as a stepping-stone to study at University.

- Students will acquire transferable skills such as communication, teamwork, research and analysis, which are valued in both higher education and the workplace.
- Students will be able to present research using knowledge and sound reasoning
- Students will develop appropriate skills and techniques in dance discipline
- Students will gain a good understanding of the work of influential practitioners to inform their own work and practice

How will I be assessed?

At Key stage 5 work is assessed through the completion of assignments for each unit throughout the course, which are internally assessed. Students are awarded Pass, Merit or Distinction.

Examinations:

Yr12 will complete 1 mock exam which is practically based towards the end of Year 12 Yr13 will complete 1 mock exam in December/January based on Unit 1 and will complete their final Unit 1 examination in May/June exam series. This is externally marked by Pearson.

Yr. 13 will complete also complete a Group Performance which is also marked by Pearson in the May/June exam series
