Dear Parents and carers

Happy New Year! For a younger generation in an uncertain world, a line from one of the many tributes pouring in rings particularly true. (The Queen) 'was the figure who more than any other brought our country together and kept us in touch with our better nature.'

However, individuals will react differently, or perhaps not at all. Whatever the response, the school and my staff will be on hand to respond and support. In the fullness of time, we should also consider ideas of how we can continue to honour the life of her majesty.















Although this has been a very varied week with so much energy and accomplishment at the start of term, it has also come to a close with the sad news about her majesty. As a mark of respect, some items of news have been withheld from this edition of the bulletin. Tutor Time – Week of 5th September

We have altered our tutor time programme for 2022/23 to have an increased focus on important aspects of student's life education. Each week we will share with parents the summary details of what has been covered so you are aware. What was covered this week is summarised below:

- Queen Elizabeth II Whole-school reflection on the sad passing of the Queen from the Headteacher.
- National Focus Week National read a book day https://nationaltoday.com/national-read-book-day/
- Wellbeing Tip 'Keep sleep regular'
- Start of the Year 7 to 11 were reminded about the school values and culture (Ready Respectful Safe) as well as our learning values (Ambitious Curious Tenacious). Discussions were had around new beginnings and the high expectations that the school has for all our students. Going forward this weekly session will allow tutors to look at their tutees attendance, behaviour and achievement data and therefore praise or set targets and actions where needed.
- CAMHS Best Version of You (Session 1) Year 7 started off by looking at the four student committees in the school which they could join (Anti Bullying, Welfare and Well Being Student Voice and Inclusivity and Diversity). They then looked at why it is important to look after yourself and thinking about ways to cope when things are not going right.
- Safeguarding (Peer on Peer/Child on Child) Year 8 to 11 looked into what Child on Child abuse is, why it is not OK for this to happen, how we stop it and report it when it does happen, various resources and further information.
- Careers Careers programme for Year 10 students looking at plans for their future.
- Study Skills Year 11 getting support for their final year and preparing for their exams and getting the most out of their studies.

House Dance Competition





This has already started but each House are keen to recruit new members, especially in Year 7 if they would like to be a part of learning a dance piece created by Year 11 House Dance Captains. The theme for the competition is 'The Future' this academic year and all teams rehearse once a week in preparation for performing in our Annual Dance Show on Monday 17th and Tuesday 18th October at 7.00pm in the Main Hall.

Nightingale and Wilberforce teams rehearse on Mondays from 3.10-4.30pm and Pankhurst and Darwin teams rehearse on Tuesdays from 3.10-4.30pm. Yateley School entered this new regional competition last year and it was thoroughly enjoyed by all! It is open to all Secondary Schools and Colleges where students get the opportunity to perform live on stage at The Guildhall in Portsmouth with an interactive LED screen as their backdrop. Students are invited to attend an audition where our friendly 6th form Dance Captains will teach a short routine, then it is your child's chance to show how much they love performing in small groups (not in front of everyone!). Those who are successful, then get selected to form the Dance Live Team and rehearse every Thursday afterschool from 3.10-4.30pm until February. There are usually two Sunday rehearsals nearer to the competition held at school to allow the team to rehearse all together for a longer period and dance in costumes etc! Last year students were asked to pay £55.00 to participate which covers the cost of coach hire to and from Portsmouth, costume/ make up, and a team t-shirt.

It's is an incredible opportunity to make friends with similar interests across all year groups and represent the school in a competition! It is a very rewarding and everyone always has a fantastic day! Parents, friends and family members can purchase tickets to see the evening show should they wish. It is always wonderful to hear the parents cheering for 'Yateley' in the auditorium!


