As I'm sure you're already fully aware, term has well and truly got underway and there is an excellent buzz about the place as students and staff are pleased to be back – or in the case of year 7, to be joining the school. There is a strong sense of purpose and ambition everywhere as term gets underway. In the circumstances, it would be wrong of me dwell on whole school performance, although we are very proud of what was achieved. However, I do want to pay tribute to the stunning work of students and staff, ably overseen by Mr Hill and Mr Conway, in generating grades that were honest, rigorous and reflected candidates' best endeavours. Most importantly of all, students can be proud of achieving 'door-opening' results which will set them up superbly for life and competitively alongside their peers elsewhere. Pictured



are two GCSE top performers, Ella Morrison and Harry Jarvis. Huge congratulations also go out to Sixth Formers Amy Capp and Megan Scotford on their impressive performance within the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) which is an admissions test used by a consortium of UK Universities for their medical and dental degree programmes. It is testament to their hard work and we wish them every luck in their medicine application.

Within a very accomplished cohort within the Sixth Form, there have been outstanding individual performances. Samuel Keys is the top performer with four A* grades at A' Level and an A* grade within his EPQ; he will be reading Natural Sciences at Durham University. He is very closely followed by Abigail Malet and Khaled Hussien who both achieved three A* grades. Abigail has secured her place at University of Birmingham to read Biomedical Science and Khaled will go on to study Medicine.













I'm sure your child has already told you about the Lateral Flow tests undertaken in school this week – another monumental effort getting everyone through and with minimal disruption to learning. For those year groups who came in on Monday to test and then leave; thank you for your forbearance with that and I'm pleased to say that the whole process ran smoothly. It is now down to students to ensure that they keep up to date with their twice-weekly home testing. Year 7 students have



been supplied today with their first set of kits to take home and other year groups will follow suit during the course of next week. Most students are familiar with what is required, although full instructions are within the kit boxes.

Open Evening and Open Mornings

We are now gearing up for our Open Evening and subsequent Open Mornings for prospective parents and students, particularly students in current Year 6. The primary schools are all being sent the publicity materials and we are obviously delighted to be able to host these events face to face and are looking forward to a really good turnout. Our virtual content created for last year will remain, but of course nothing quite substitutes for visiting in person. Please let anyone know who you think might be interested and who may not otherwise be aware and also please note that a large number of our current students will be involved on the evening of Thursday 30th September, either as guides, or within subjects.



BYOD

Parents will be pleased to know that the BYOD devices have been received in school and the IT department are now setting them up ready to allocate to those students who have purchased a device through the school scheme. We are planning to distribute them to the year 7 students during their ICT lessons commencing next week, students in all other year groups will received theirs during tutor time next week.

















Parent information: PE Kit requirements

We know that all new starter parents will have had this information in your school induction packs but we would like to just remind all existing parents of the School PE guidelines. We follow the current Hampshire safety requirements these are as follows:

- All students must wear sports trainers and NOT plimsolls including skater/vans/hi-top or fashion trainers for PE, or indeed anything with a flat sole and minimum grip. Students will not be allowed to wear footwear if it does not comply with the regulations.
- Students should wear studded boots for rugby and football.
- **No jewellery** is allowed to be worn at any time in PE (including stud earrings, and personal activity trackers). You are advised to get any ear piercings done at the start of the summer holidays so that the ears have time to heal before September. **No taping of the ear is allowed at Yateley School**
- All long hair and fringes must be tied back off the face. This regulation applies to all students.
- It is recommended that students wear a mouth guard for rugby and hockey and shin pads for rugby, hockey and football. These can be purchased from most sports shops.
- If students wish to wear the school's navy blue track pants or leggings and the training top in the colder months they can do so with their teacher's permission. However they must ensure they have their PE shorts and T-shirt for every lesson as they are a compulsory requirement for all indoor lessons and the spring/summer terms. PE teachers will make it clear to students what is appropriate clothing for each activity.
- Swimming costumes need to be a one piece costume with no fashion cut outs. Boys' shorts must be above the knee. Swim hats and goggles are optional.

















Dance Live Competition














Dance at Yateley School Year 7 Dance Club


