This has enabled each group to decide on a centrally agreed message and then with an opportunity for individuals to write a short tribute of their own if they wish and then sign. Visitors will also have seen a photograph, flowers and a commemorative display in our newly refurbished Reception area.



Open Events It won't have escaped your notice that our Open Event season is upon us and we will be eagerly

May I remind you that on Tuesday 27th September, we play host to upwards of 350 Year 6 pupils? Students in Years 7-10 and Year 12 will not be in school on that day and will be set their work online. Year 11 and Year 13 students are in school and expected to attend as normal. Thank you very much indeed for your



support with this and my apologies for any disruption that is caused.

The Open Evening that follows on Thursday 29th September is a massive event for the school and many of our existing students will be involved in one way or another. We ask that all of the students involved have signed in via the Sixth Form reception by 5.45 pm and the evening finishes at 9pm. Again, thank you so much for your support with that and I am very appreciative of any help you can give in promoting this with friends and families – especially if they have children looking for secondary school in September 2023. 





The larder is a community larder run by volunteers for the benefit of their local community. We are located at:

EVERY Monday: Between 1pm - 2.30pm

St Barnabas Church Brinns Lane Darby Green GU17 0BT

We are a membership scheme aimed at helping people make their money go further by reducing food shopping bills (members can make a considerable saving each year)

Memberships vary dependent on the size of your household: Initially membership fees can only be paid in cash.

Single person - £2.50 per week - for this you are entitled to 10 products per week, including fruit and vegetables

2-person plus household - £3.50 per week – for this you are entitled to 15 products per week, including fruit and vegetables

4-person plus household - £5.00 per week - for this you are entitled to 25 products per week, including fruit and vegetables

Your bag will be prepared, in advance, we will strive to offer a variety of products. It is estimated that your bag will hold an average of £10-£15 worth of produce (dependent on household size) A bag can consist of some of these items: Pasta, rice, coffee, tea bags, tinned meats, tinned fish, tinned desserts, soups, along with fresh fruit and vegetables. It may also include the odd fridge product such as cheese. (For this, you will need to bring with you an insulated cool bag & confirm that you are monitoring your fridge/freezer temperature at home)

A membership form needs to be completed and proof of address/ID needs to be provided, unless a recognised referral agent refers you to the scheme. Application forms can be requested by emailing: <a href="https://www.scheme.org.uk">FSSouthernCentral@fareshare.org.uk</a>. These need to be returned to this email address

Members are required to keep up weekly membership by attending the Larder on a weekly basis and paying their membership fee. Failure to attend for three consecutive weeks may mean that your membership will be offered to someone on the waiting list.

In line with GDPR your details will be kept by FareShare, and will not be shared with any other 3<sup>rd</sup> party. This is a requirement of our compliance procedure. Further information upon request.

















Spotlight Uk are currently looking for young people aged 8-16 years who want to make a difference in their community to take part in our Youth Social Action Project from September 2022 and become Spotlight Youth Ambassadors.
