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We were so pleased with the 350+ responses from our 2022 Parent Survey last year, but one thing jumped out as needing improvement at Yateley School. When asked *"The School makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year"* almost 50% of parents either disagreed or felt this could be improved upon. After months of work, we are delighted to present to you our Learning Journeys (personalised for every year group). Our Learning Journeys cover all the key dates in the year, all of our subjects and what students are learning this year. We also explain how parents/carers can help, give details of our tutor program and PSHE, identify all extra curricula opportunities available and also highlight the teams, clubs and societies that we run. We know it can be busy as a parent, so having everything in one place should make life a lot easier in this hectic world! By the time this bulletin hits your inbox, every family should have received a physical and electronic copy of this next week, so do please look out. Open Evening

There's a lot of awareness now about the Year 6 taster day on Tuesday 27th and then the Open Evening on Thursday 29th September. Every space (350 of them) has been allocated for the taster day and we are currently expecting well over 600 people on Thursday evening! Despite our best efforts, there is bound to be some congestion in and around School Lane, so thank you in advance for your patience with that as we have a lot of current students helping us on the night. May I also reiterate the key points from the SchoolComms messages? On Tuesday 27th, Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12 are **not** in school and their work will be set on Satchel:One; Years 11 and 13 **are** in school as normal. Excellence...

Last year, Dr Case undertook the monumental task of interviewing, joint planning and constructively challenging a significant proportion of Year 11 students, with a series of one-to-one discussions throughout the year. She then remained in regular contact with students and parents throughout the year, trouble shooting and supporting all the while. The impact of this intervention has been plain to see and is one of the factors behind improved 2022 GCSE results. Consequently, the program is already underway for the current Year 11 and Dr Case tells me that the early signs are very positive indeed and the year group are in a very good place for this time in the year and with plenty of ambition. It'll be a lot of hard work, but hopes are very high for this year group.

Sixth Form Open Evening

Calling all Year 11 students and their families in Yateley School and beyond! On Thursday 6th October we are holding



our hugely important Sixth Form Open Evening and we are looking forward to welcoming all the prospective Sixth Formers, both from our own school and from other secondary schools in the area. Uniform reminders




























