Learning Together – Empowered for Life

Dear Parents and Carers

As you will know, guidance on school operation thorough the pandemic has changed frequently and continues to do so, as we try to 'find our feet' in this Autumn term and an attempt to move towards something more resembling normality. Transmission rates seem to vary considerably region by region and even within a relatively small area like Hart. So far, our numbers of recorded positive cases have been modest, but that could change very rapidly. At the time of writing, there is no need to step back to former measures – face coverings, year group mustering, staggered starts etc, but I should give fair warning that some extraordinary measures may be required in the near future should our circumstances change. In the meantime, please be meticulous with the twice-weekly student LFD testing and let us know if there is a positive result. If there is a positive result on a Lateral Flow Test, that person **must** take a confirmatory PCR test at an official centre and self-isolate until the result is known. If the PCR comes back negative, the student can return to school; if it is positive, they must self-isolate for 10 days and for any symptoms to have gone. If you have a confirmed case within your household, NHS advice is to get PCR tests for all other occupants prior to them attending work, college or school. You will hopefully have seen from my earlier School Comms message, that the planned rollout of the nasal flu vaccination and the NHS offer of a Pfizer Biontec Covid vaccination to 12-15 year olds has been delayed in this school. We already have your response to the E-consent form for the nasal flu vaccination and this now looks likely to now take place in mid-November. The Covid vaccination is likely to be offered separately in mid-October, probably just before half term. Parents will be asked to make a separate decision about whether you want your child to receive the Covid vaccine and a separate paper-based consent form will be sent home in due course. Open Events – As you will be aware by now, we have a number of Open Events happening over the next fortnight in



order to get the next generation of Yateley families informed and ready for what we have on offer. Obviously, in the current climate, we have had to make some adaptations to our format, although it is also a great opportunity to freshen things up. The first major event is the Open Evening on Thursday 30th September. Although the doors open at 6pm, the evening starts properly at 6.15. The first Headteacher talk is at 6.30pm and the second at 7.30pm. Student led tours will be operating throughout the evening. Parking may well be an

issue, although we do have the use of our own carparks, the Library carpark and the Westfields schools' carparks.

The second element of the open events are the Open Mornings for prospective families on Tuesday 5th and Wednesday 6th October. Details can be seen on the link from our <u>homepage</u>.
