Thank you very much for your support with Open Evening, however you were involved. It was a great success, with visitors coming in from far and wide. We noted how much interest there was from families a little further afield and they were all keen to find out about the distinctive Yateley School offer and by all accounts left pleased and keen to join us. I should point out from the outset what superb ambassadors the students have been for our school. Their enthusiasm and commitment to the school is unparalleled in my experience and they bring the whole thing to life. I know the guides leading the ours did a super job, as of course did the young people helping in departments. Thank you! Despite the fact that other local schools held open evenings on the same

night, over 600 people visited us! It is worth noting that successful applicants have come from over 30 primary schools into our current year 7 and placing Yateley School as first choice on the application form and applying within the correct timescale meant that those families did all get a place. Also, a number of people have enquired about transport and we will, of course, be responsive to need and look to extend and enhance our school bus network as required. It is also worth noting that we have Open Mornings on Tuesday and Wednesday of next week and our school will once again be on show during the working day.



Geography fieldwork Year 13 had a very successful week in Dale, West Wales this week. They completed their four days of compulsory fieldwork for their Geography non-examined assessment, which is 20% of their A level grade. Students also spent time in the classroom looking at a variety of fieldwork techniques, analysing data and presentation techniques. Students have chosen a variety of human and physical topics that they will now be working on up until Christmas.

The students were an absolute credit to Mr Tidd and Miss Self - a particular highlight for them was crabbing on Wednesday night as a treat for their hard work! They were incredibly impressed with the students' commitment and hard work throughout the week; two of them even went straight into open evening as tour guides!

The students learned about cases, roles and responsibilities within the courts and the qualifications required; including the various routes available to qualify as Lawyers and Barristers. Students were able to try on gowns and wigs and discuss topics such as the death penalty, sentencing and responsibilities of the jury and magistrates.

Visiting author. We were delighted to welcome Matt Dickinson to the school on Friday. Matt is a climber, explorer, film-maker and writer and has written a number of books, both fiction and non-fiction, using his life experiences. Matt

has successfully climbed to the top of Mount Everest and engaged the whole of year 8 with stories of his experiences and, also, his writing journey.

Matt enhanced his talk with short videos and photos of his expeditions and held nothing back in describing the hazards of living in these treacherous environments. His talk was informative, interactive and enjoyable and kept the year 8 students engaged throughout, with students asking plenty of questions



at the end. Matt also ran a creative writing workshop for a number of year 9 students where they explored the topic, 'Should Mount Everest be closed?' Students were also able to purchase one of Matt's books and have it signed by Matt; a lasting reminder of a memorable day!




