Dear Parents and Carers

As you will know it has been a very busy and successful week with the highlight being Open Evening on Thursday. Robin provided some fantastic advice on strengthening an application and Mr Conway shared work experience opportunities and introduced our partnership with Medic Mentor. Medic Mentor provides the UK's largest medical scholarship programme and a variety of mentoring initiatives. They support talented students from application to



graduation and we are delighted to see 14 of our students start on this pathway.




Players of all abilities are invited to play chess in **C2.1** on **Thursday Lunchtime**.

Well done Anthonie.


































Monkeys and Banana\$
