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### Learning Together – Empowered for Life

Dear Parents and Carers

The last few weeks have been something of a whirlwind, not least with the number of visitors that we've been able to welcome onsite and the general level of interest and engagement that we clearly have in the wider community. This week we have been able to turn our attention to great work in the classroom. Students this week will have seen teaching staff in their lessons armed with clipboards. This is because we have as a staff completed 76 paired learning walks with colleagues looking at a snapshot of what happens in our classrooms each day. We then discussed the excellent practice seen in lessons, looking at how it can be integrated in different departments and gave next steps advice on how to improve on the great practice we have seen. This work has enabled teachers to talk with colleagues across the whole school about learning and teaching. It is exciting and important work in our continued drive to raise standards at Yateley School.

As you will know, I'm sure, Covid vaccinations are being administered for 12-15 year old students in our school on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October. This is strictly on the basis of parental consent only. The return rate on the paper consent form has been very high – thank you – and if this has not yet been returned, please do so. It is important that we get returns, whatever your decision, whether it is consent given or consent not given. If a consent form is not returned, your child will not receive the vaccine and may not get a future opportunity.

Secondly, to make the process as smooth and quick as possible, we need all students wearing a short-sleeved top underneath their school jumper on 22<sup>nd</sup> October. That way the jumper can be taken off in advance and the vaccination easily administered. **If your child is receiving the vaccine, please make sure they are wearing either their PE top or their summer polo shirt for that day only**. The rest of the uniform requirement remains as normal. This message will be repeated by School Comms next week.

One of our thrills in teaching always comes from supporting our students to learn, whatever their various needs may be. Pictured with a student is a wonderful dog named Jackson, who comes to Yateley School and provides emotional



support as a therapy dog to students. Jackson is always a welcome visitor on site and is also something of a celebrity wherever he goes. Jackson also provides

nervous students with the comfort they need to make them confident enough to access their learning. In the middle of the photos (sitting proudly on his throne as the king of C-block!) is BOB, our robot that provides a home video link for students, thus enabling them to access all of our lessons live. BOB lets any student at home control him, turning left and right when needed and also speak to other students around the room during group activities. BOB can also participate in Q+A with the teacher via an inbuilt speaker, meaning even when our students are at home... they can be in school.

















And finally, we're delighted to show you our brand new "Accelerated Learning" centre; affectionately known as AL! Our Accelerated Learning Centre is a hub that allows all students from all year groups to get bespoke intervention across all subjects. Using our trained Higher Level Teaching Assistants (HLTAs) our students in AL get the required accelerated learning through additional support of their needs. What does all this teach us? Well it teaches us that by learning together, we can be empowered for life!

The Sixth Form Freshers' Party was held at The Ely, Camberley on Thursday 14th and had sold out within five days of tickets going on sale. The enthusiasm amongst the students was clear to see and the party certainly lived up to the billing! The dance floor was packed all evening and it was a truly great event. 


Volunteering Opportunity at Yateley School
