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
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Learning Together – Empowered for Life

Dear Parents and carers,

As we commence the half term holiday, I'd like to start this week's bulletin with my profound thanks for your support and encouragement over the last seven demanding, but very rewarding weeks. Despite issues in the surrounding area, we've managed to go through the whole period without a COVID outbreak in school and that has to be noted with gratitude. Clearly, it is just as important, if not more so, in the approach to winter to not drop our guard and become complacent. The simplicity and efficiency of our systems have worked; notably doubled lessons, staff marshalling their classes, massively increased hand hygiene and room sanitising. None of this must be allowed to slip, particularly as the situation is likely to become more rather than less challenging.

This afternoon, I have circulated a video for all students in Years 7 - 11 to watch in class. It describes our outside mustering arrangements for after half term. Use of the fields has become increasingly problematic as they've become wet and muddy - necessitating the use of the tarmacked areas around the main body of the school site. The illustration below will give you a broad indication of what we have planned. The Sixth Form have their own space, plus



a new marquee which is being erected in the garden during the half term holiday. Staff will continue to escort classes to and from the muster points. Also, please note that we will use the wet weather bases when we are forced, but cold weather will not be a reason. Most students are now coming to school with an appropriate winter coat, but do please obtain one if your child currently doesn't possess a

warm coat. I believe that all students and families realise that although these arrangements may be a bit uncomfortable at times, they are a necessary safety precaution.

As you may already be aware, there has been an occurrence of Covid19 in the Nursery. The nursery manager followed protocol to the letter and all parents in the affected bubbles have been informed and families have been given the correct advice where required on their child needing to self-isolate. If an individual child then goes on to develop













symptoms, the parents would need to self-isolate while a test result for the child is obtained. Although we are colocated, there is no transmission link with the school and it has had no impact on the school operation.

Sports Personality of the Year award. Sadly, school closure denied us the annual pleasure of the Sports Personality awards evening in the summer. This is an amazing celebration of our extraordinary talent within PE and Sport and a recognition of the work of the department. The amount and quality of our sporting success both within school and extra-curricular is formidable and this evening showcases some of that success. In a very muted ceremony, the award winners have received their certificates and trophies and it gives me great pleasure to announce and celebrate the success of our two top award winners – Sports Personalities of the Year 2020, Caitlin Milsom and Ben Elsey.
