We stand up to bullying and child on child abuse

It's not okay! Today marked the culmination of a week of highlighting issues around bullying and child on child abuse. It is the most important thing for a child to be able to learn properly at school. In order to do that, they need to always feel safe and have someone to turn to if things go wrong. We know that we have a great school culture and that is in large part due to the high levels of pastoral care in the school. Our students know how to treat each other and that all adults in the building are here to help. Work on anti-bullying is woven into PSHE, Tutor time, assemblies and other areas of the curriculum. Children in our school are also very familiar with the Ready, Respectful and Safe ethos of the school and know who the trained adults are who can help them. However, we are always looking to improve and have used the assemblies this week, badge wearing and other activities to say 'it's not okay'. We are particularly calling out the harmful comments and prejudicial remarks which can have such capacity to hurt, both physically and verbally in our day-to-day interactions, but also particularly online. We all know what a toxic and risky space some aspects of internet interaction can be and we are constantly looking to upskill our students in dealing with that. We ask that parents remain fully on board with this and encourage you to talk to your child about these issues at home.



To reinforce the point in an unforgettable way, **all** staff wore an 'it's not okay' T shirt (kindly sponsored) on Friday in school. Where possible this has led to discussion in class and an opportunity to reinforce the message.



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House Dance and Dance Show. There is a full report later in this bulletin. 

Parental advice on drugs

As parents and educators, it is so important that we keep up to date as much as possible on the types of drugs that young people might be able to access and come into contact with by ensuring we all have a good drug awareness. It is also important to stay ahead of new trends that take place. In recent years nationally there has been a reduction in the amount of young people that smoke, however there has been an increase in vaping and using other drugs like NOS cannisters and balloons and cannabis. Some young people believe these new trends to not be as harmful as smoking, but that is not correct, and actually they can cause more harm and addiction.

Yateley School educates our students around drug awareness and this is very much covered within the PSHE curriculum, however we wanted to ensure that parents also have all the information needed to support you to be on the lookout in the community.

This details lots of facts and education about all the different drugs and the information is aimed for young people, educators and parents. As well as information the site provides help and advice and contact details for further support.

If you are ever concerned about your child possibly taking or being involved with any drugs then please do speak to them about it and of course contact the school pastoral team for further advice and guidance.

Attendance on Satchel:One – 90% is not as good as it sounds!

When it comes to a child's attendance at school, it is very simple... **Every day and minute counts!!!!**

Sometimes we think that getting a score of 90% sounds good, but when that comes to attendance it is not. This means you have missed a whole day of school every two weeks, which is 4 whole periods of lessons and learning. Within a year this is just under 4 weeks of learning missed. This is learning that you can't get back and will impact on future academic success and personal development. We really want to encourage young people and parents to be aware of your child's attendance, therefore it is shared with you via the Satchel:One app.

Attendance appears on the students and parents' homepage so you can see it easily - following the attendance tab (blue background with a yellow tick) on your home screen. If you are not linked to your child's accounts in Satchel:One then you need to contact [@Admin](#) so we can provide the information for you. You will also see your child's achievement points and all the homework that is set for them.

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Year 8 Stay Safe Days and Parent Evening

On Tuesday 1st November to Thursday 3rd November 2022 all Year 8 students will be taking part in a whole educational day in school as provided by Hart Community Safety and some guest presenters. This is a heavily subsidised offering in line with the Safer North Hampshire's Partnership Plan priorities to tackle a number of issues affecting our young people. This is focused on staying safe. Year 8 students will only take part in one of the three days (and therefore only be off timetable for one of the three days).

The days provide a series of interactive educational learning experiences designed to raise knowledge and awareness whilst providing methods for building resilience, mental toughness and highlighting how best to respond, seek support and remain safe, when presented with challenging circumstances with a specific focus in Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE).

It has been designed in partnership with educational/social professionals and co-designed with young people and devised specifically for a Secondary School audience, primarily years 7 through to 10.

They have been created specifically to support vulnerable young people who are at risk of becoming exploited by criminal gangs and young people who are at risk of becoming involved in offending behaviour and are intended as early intervention with the aim of 'inspiring change and improving the lives of young people'.

Numerous other local secondary schools have already taken part in this within 2021/22 to very positive feedback.

Regarding which tutor groups will take part on which day (and therefore miss their normal lessons), the breakdown is:

- Tuesday 1st November = 8NN and 8WN
- Wednesday 2nd November = 8DN, 8NS, 8WS
- Thursday 3rd November = 8DS, 8PN, 8PS

Parent Evening Session: There is a parent evening session which will be held on Wednesday 2nd November from 18.30 to 20.00 in the school main hall. Year 8 parents that attend will experience the same drama production that the students will have seen and then get talked through the Making Meaning process and have an opportunity to ask the characters any questions they may have. We really encourage as many Year 8 parents to attend as possible. Some quotes from parents from other local secondary schools that attended the parent sessions are:

Yateley School is dedicated to our safeguarding education for our students, staff and parents. These Year 8 focus days and the parent session all feed well into the education and plans that Yateley School has in place for our young people via the PSHE/RSE curriculum and tutor time safeguarding sessions all to ensure our young people are safe and we support their continued personal development. These Year 8 focus days and parent evening will also come off the back of the schools focus week (17th to 21st October) on 'It's Not OK' where we are drawing attention to the topics of bullying and child on child abuse to ensure that we all stand together and against these harmful topics.

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
