The aim of these meetings is to identify any barriers to learning and to support students in overcoming them, so that they are able and confident to access the next stage in their education and career.

The programme is based solely around academic progress with support for revision, time management, and challenge to individual expectations being the focus of this. To support all Year 11 students, Dr Case has reissued the knowledge organisers LINK HERE that support the acquisition of information for examinations — these are available on Satchel One to all Year 11 students. The excellence programme is going to be expanded to support additional groups of students, based on need, after the half term holiday. 


























Yateley School Careers and Futures Fair 2021
