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#### Learning Together – Empowered for Life

Dear Parents and Carers

Covid, weather and outside spaces. We have continued to be relatively fortunate in comparison with many other schools in terms of covid transmission and the damaging impact of resultant school absence. A great many schools in this area (and nationally) have had the need to return to face coverings (masks) and reintroducing a number of the restrictions in operation last year, such as staggered start times, one-way systems etc. So far, we have managed to avoid this, although the situation could change imminently and I should be clear that we won't hesitate to institute

further measures – including masks, if the situation demands it and PHE advise that it is the best way of keeping our community as safe as possible. One change will be required from next week however and this is a return to the hard-standing areas for break and lunchtime. The fields are treacherous with mud now and as you'd expect, we cannot in the current circumstances let the students have unrestricted access to the buildings. Therefore, we will be returning to use of the hard standing areas from Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November onwards. When the weather is wet, or excessively cold we will have indoor space available and the students will be advised of where their specific areas are. In the meantime, for anything less than extreme weather, please make sure your child has a warm, waterproof coat, labelled with their name, which they then take to school.



Parents' Consultation Evenings. We had an overwhelmingly positive response to the introduction of online parents' consultation evenings and as mentioned before the summer holidays, these will continue this year. The convenience of being able to access these virtually has given much more flexibility and improved attendance. When needed, it has also enabled parents in different locations to access the meeting and has also reduced the inconvenience of having to park onsite, or having to wait for appointments which can sometimes overrun. The first evening of this academic year is for the Sixth Form on Thursday 11th November, followed a week later by Year 11. All of the joining information is sent to parents prior to the relevant evening and details can be entered HERE.



Remembrance. We will be joining the Yateley Community for the annual act of Remembrance on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2021. The annual Remembrance Parade in Yateley is once again taking place in person this year. We would like to invite all Yateley School students to join us at 2.15pm at St Swithun's Church for an outdoor Service of Remembrance followed by a parade to the War Memorial on the Reading Road where our Senior Students will lay a wreath on behalf of the school population.

All students are welcome to attend, in school uniform please. As this is a public event, parents are responsible for the children and no forms are required to be completed. Students will be dismissed at the end of the service from the War Memorial.


















#### Student star of the week

#### Cold Weather & Being Outside

From Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November we are going to be asking for students to return to using the outside hard standing areas at break and lunchtimes. The two fields are becoming too damaged due to the poor weather and mud and mess being walked through the indoor areas. We also don't want students based in tutor or mixing too much at break and lunch. The areas will be as follows:

- Year 7 = A Block playground
- Year 8 = Area in middle of the school from the nurse's office to Tech block (all between B and C Blocks)
- Year 9 = Area between A and B Block by the gym, PE office and A Block gate
- Year 10 = Area next to Music and path going towards Yateley's Gym
- Year 11 = Tennis Courts

The canteen will of course still be open to everyone as will the main hall for students to eat in. Students will only be allowed in these listed areas and nowhere else in the school during break and lunch (not in classrooms, corridors, fields, front of school, etc). The only difference will be if it is a wet weather day and then we will inform students that they will then be based in their tutor room for break/lunch that day and can also still access the canteen and main hall.

Therefore, can we please ask parents to ensure your child comes to school in a suitably warm coat in case of cold weather?

#### Year 11 Prom Decisions

Each year we really look forward to our Year 11 students attending the prom as well as their final graduation assembly in the summer term. As we know the Year 11 students need to meet criteria to attend both events. One is to have an attendance of at least above 90% during Year 11. The second is to have 100 or more conduct/prom points at the end of Year 11 (these are their house points minus their behaviour points minus the amount of lates they have recorded). We have identified some Year 11 students from the Term 1 data that are either not meeting both or one of these criteria and therefore will be getting a letter from the school next week just to point this out to them (and if the decision were made now would not be attending the events) but they still have time in Year 11 to address the issue. If a Year 11 student does not get a letter then currently they are meeting criteria.

















