With **Antibullying week** coming up next week (14<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> November) it was very timely training, and allowed our Ambassadors to learn about what bullying is and equipped them to support their peers if it does happen. Over the course of Anti-Bullying week, we will be introducing our new Ambassador team to the rest of the school and will be sharing the details of support that is available for each and everyone at Yateley School. Students can speak to our Ambassadors, drop into our safe space or use our dedicated email address (<u>antibullying@yateley.hants.sch.uk</u>), which is monitored by the Staff Ambassadors and can be used to report bullying or to ask for support. In addition to these school support provisions we are also able to share The Diana Award Crisis Messenger service with our students. This service provides free, 24/7 crisis support across the UK. If a young person is in crisis, they can text DA to 85258. Trained volunteers will listen to how they're feeling and help them think the next step towards feeling better.



**Yateley Sixth Form Taster Day** The taster day on Wednesday was a fantastic opportunity to assist Year 11 students with their post-16 subject options and to give them a taste of what life is like at our *Outstanding* Sixth Form.

Over 70 taster sessions were held with students having the opportunity to take part in four sessions each. This gave students an insight into a Sixth Form lesson, the depth of knowledge covered and the bespoke support which comes from a smaller college provider. 






### STEM Master Class : Dapnia (water flea) physiology


