Dear Parents and Carers

I hope this finds you well and after a busy week of activity in school. Thank you to the Year 11 parents and families who joined us for Parents' Consultation evening on Thursday. I hope the technology worked well for you and that you were able to participate and receive helpful feedback from the comfort of your own home, office, or wherever you took the call... I also remind all parents and carers that the nasal-flu vaccination is planned for this coming Monday (22.11.21). Obviously, this will only be given to those students whose parents have given e-consent. Some of the arrangements are still dependent on personnel from NHS, although provisionally the 'running order' will be:


















House Music - 15th December 2021

We intend to present you with a live evening concert that will be held in the Main Hall, starting at 7pm. I am not able to estimate when will it end but there will be an interval between the first and second half. Awards will be presented at the end of the concert.

All participants will spend their school day from 8:15am until 3:10pm setting up the Main Hall and rehearsing one final time with tech and lighting. 




I am meeting with all House Music participants this week to inform them about the final preparations and to answer any questions they still may have.
