# Mobile Phone, Ear/Headphones, Toilet Usage Update – As from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> December

We have decided to review and change the guidance and expectations around the use of mobile phones and ear/headphones within school. This is due to various reasons around

student mental health and screen time, inappropriate postings on social media, etc. We have also updated guidance around access and usage of school toilets due to some issues of a few students abusing the amount of missed lesson time and some incidents of damage.

We have created updated policies which have been shared with the staff body for consultation. We will be informing all students of the new guidance during the house assemblies in the week beginning 29<sup>th</sup> November. The new guidance will be effective as from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> December and we do request that all parents and carers support the school with this. #### Uniform & Cold Weather Update

The temperatures have dropped recently, added with the fact we are asking students to be outside in the year groups areas at break and lunch, we need to ensure students are comfortable and in the correct uniform. Some students have been very professional in presenting different ideas around possible changes in the school

uniform policy to accommodate the reduced temperatures. After lengthy discussions, we wanted to confirm to all that the current school uniform policy will remain unchanged. Therefore to summarise some key parts:

- Leggings are not allowed as a replacement for the school skirt/tights or trousers. Trousers or skirt should be worn.
- Trainers are not allowed unless there is written professional medical evidence as to why
- Hoodies and any non-school jumper are not allowed, only the school jumper should be worn.
- Students should be wearing an appropriate warm winter coat which is a plain single dark colour.

#### Ex Computer science student – George Davies, what he's doing now



It was lovely to hear from one of my ex-students, George Davies, who studied Computer Science GCSE and A level here at Yateley School. I thought you would be interested to hear what he did after:

After leaving Yateley I went to study Computer Science at the University of Liverpool where I have just graduated with a First. Since graduating I have completed a summer internship as a Software Engineer at R3, an enterprise blockchain company, and have recently started working full time at a cryptocurrency-focused high-frequency trading firm. My role is to develop strategies, primarily in Python but I also often use Solidity, Rust and Go, that find and execute arbitrage opportunities created from decentralised exchanges built on blockchains like Ethereum and Avalanche. DeFi is a rapidly expanding and incredibly exciting area to be working in right now and Computer Science was the perfect degree for a career in this industry, I strongly

recommend anyone interested in Computer Science or the financial markets to take a look!

It was so interesting to hear that Python, which we start teaching students in year 7, is the main programming language he is using although probably not to draw shapes as our year 7s do! He also said that Computer Science is an important subject if you are thinking of taking Maths or Sciences as there are a lot of programming modules in them.










## **Religious Studies Poetry Competition**














## This week's sports results




