Some worked through it very quickly, but if you got stuck the guide would always be there to help. After building the frame we moved to customising the robot. This was my favourite bit as there were lots of parts to choose from and if













you were missing a piece you could ask to get it from the spares so your creation was never restricted. When we programmed it, the guide went around checking our robots; we could make it go forward, backwords, right, left and we could programme it to make sounds when it reached the goal. In the app we used many algorithms and we could never run out of options for what we wanted it to do.
