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

Dear parents and carers.

We have reached the end of the penultimate week of term, largely without incident – and despite a few niggles we're operating with business as usual and that surely has to be pretty remarkable. I'd like to thank the whole school community, staff, students and parents for your continued vigilance and support. As I've previously mentioned, any incidence of Covid in school from now on will, in all probability, result in some individuals receiving a self-isolation notice over Christmas – something I'm desperately keen to avoid. Being doubly careful and not taking any unnecessary risks is even more important, and at a time when we're tired and perhaps more likely to be complacent, a timely reminder is needed.



End of term arrangements (These will also be published in alternative formats). We do plan to make the last day of term as normal as possible. You may have heard talk of some schools taking an inset day on Friday 18th December. I have canvassed our local schools and no-one is planning on doing this as it would cause immense disruption and have little impact on transmission. Unless the situation changes markedly over the next

few days, I plan for school to be open as normal on Friday 18th December. However, the last Friday is, as always, an early finish. Lessons and a tutor session will run in the morning, there will be an extended break with food being served and school will finish for students at the following times:

- 12.35 Year 7 & 8 to leave site
- 12.45 Year 9, 10 and 11 to leave site and tutors escort out via year group exits.
- 12.50 Sixth Form to leave site
- 13.00 All school busses depart

It seems an appropriate point to remind you that Monday 4th January is an INSET day. A small number of Year 11 and Year 13 students will be in school and the remainder of the school return on Tuesday 5th January 2021 which is a Week A (Blue week). Year 11s will return straight to their hugely important mock exams and after the unforeseen issues of 2020, the importance of these mocks and careful preparation over Christmas cannot be overstated.

Year 9 GCSE options. On Thursday 10 December 2020, our Year 9 Options website launched at <u>www.yateleyschool.net/Y9Options</u>. Students can view specially created videos and curriculum pages for every subject that we are offering, as well as discovering what they will be learning in our core subjects. This is followed on Monday 04 January 2021 (the INSET Day) by teachers of all subjects hosting an online live Q+A sessions via Microsoft Teams for parents and students. This is a great opportunity to find out more about the courses we offer and also to ask those questions that might help make your mind up! Options selection takes place from Tuesday 5 January until Tuesday 12 January 2021.
