Attendance appears on the students and parents' homepage so you can see it easily following the attendance tab (blue background with a yellow tick) on your home screen. If you are not linked to your child's accounts in Satchel:One then you need to contact <a href="Market Admin"><u>@Admin</u></a> so we can provide the information for you. You will also see your child's achievement points and all the homework that is set for them.

If you have any concerns about your child's attendance, then please do contact the school (your child's tutor or Head of House) as soon as possible so we can work with you to help support this.

Our first artwork practical was using acrylic paint and Perspex sheets.
















Then the students used the Paint3D software to generate two different fractals.




