Dear Parents and carers,

It is my hope that this is the last you'll hear from me about Lateral Flow Tests! (Perhaps not). We have now conducted over 6000 in school and where some schools have reported take-up rates of around 50%, we had take-up of over 98%! The big in-school provision is now closed and we have retained a small testing area for emergency use only. I would like to take this public opportunity to thank the following:

- Firstly our amazing colleagues and volunteers who staffed the whole thing and kept 10 testing bays running like . clockwork over three successive sets of tests
- Second the students, who without exception were courteous, responsive and grateful for the opportunity to • keep themselves and the wider community safe
- And finally... you the parents and carers who have given us your full support throughout and without whom this ۰ could not have happened.

As we approach something that looks a little more like normal life, I am at pains to point out to the students and school community that we need to remain on our guard and that as warmer weather and the Easter holidays approach, we mustn't become complacent and let other measures like social distancing and hand hygiene slip. I am



already hearing of schools where some students are being sent home to self-isolate and I'd dearly like to avoid that in Yateley School if possible.

By this stage your child should have come home with two boxes of home test kits (shown in the picture). If not, please contact the school and we can help. You can also order kits for home delivery HERE.

I sent a separate School Comms on Tuesday with instructions for carrying out the tests and you should currently have enough supply to carry out six tests, starting this Sunday. We've suggested to students that they put a reminder on their phones for Sunday evening to remember to do it. They will certainly need adult supervision the first time they do it. Thank you in advance for your help with this.

Not only have our Year 11 come back to LFD tests, they've also had to contend with mock exams which finished today. The students have been absolutely magnificent. The exams have run without a hitch and conduct has been impeccable. In the strange circumstances in which we find ourselves this year, we will look to build on their successes in the weeks to come and secure the best possible grade that we can.
