Dear parents and carers,

There have, as you know, been very recent changes to the requirements on face coverings which were announced on Wednesday afternoon. We have responded quickly as you will be aware and essentially reverted to the expectations that were in place before Christmas. Students and staff need to wear face coverings in communal areas and their use in classrooms is not now mandatory – provided the room is sufficiently proportioned and properly ventilated. We have, however, continued to take the view that there are certain classroom situations when the wearing of face coverings is appropriate and this is up to the individual teacher to determine. Students need to continue having a mask available in school for the time being, but with the understanding that these requirements may well change soon. We will keep a very careful eye on the transmission rate in and around school and reserve the right to change our requirements if the situation deteriorates and we need to take further measures. As any changes emerge, we will of course inform you as quickly as we possibly can.

*** Students have been given a further box of Lateral Flow tests this afternoon to take home with them. Please help us by making sure that the twice weekly testing continues – ideally on Wednesdays and Sundays. ***




Yateley School Student Focus Groups

Uniform Expectations – Face mask update

Based on the changes from the government, we have updated the guidance to the uniform summary to include the new guidance around face marks. They are not needed in lessons now but all students should still have them and wear them around school in communal areas currently.


