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### **Learning Together – Empowered for Life**

Dear Parents and Carers

We are very conscious that our time with extraordinary Year 11 and Year 13 students is coming towards a close. They have worked extremely hard - sometimes to the point of near exhaustion to fulfil all the assessed tasks that they've

needed to do in order for teachers to input an accurate and authentic grade for their GCSE and A' Level subjects. We will be talking to students in person about the arrangements for the last two weeks of this term and for the targeted support week in the first week back after the half term holiday. Some students will be required to attend during targeted support week, but not all. By Friday 11th of June, we will have all the assessed information that we need for each student. The picture shows Mrs Rampton in Business Studies doing what teachers have been doing a huge amount of recently – marking! It will be worth it on results day.



However, we will not be abandoning our Year 11 and 13 students in the next few weeks; there will be a programme in place for them for the remainder of June. This exciting summer transition programme for both Year 11 and Year 13 starting from 14<sup>th</sup> June which will get our students ready for their next steps into Sixth form, University, an apprenticeship or the world of work. This will keep their minds active and engaged with a programme which will develop their personnel skills. We have continued our partnership with Eton College and are delighted to be running their online Resilience Course and Interview Skills Course. In a rapidly changing world, students need to be great communicators, great collaborators, adaptable, resilient and creative. EtonX delivers courses that bridge the gap between academic success and life in the real world. For Year13, we are running practical sessions from cooking on a budget to how to obtain a mortgage. We also have our face-to-face getting ready day for Year 11 going into Year 12 on 6<sup>th</sup> July – we look forward to welcoming them back!



You will hopefully have seen my earlier message on Schoolcomms about face coverings and the changing requirements from the government in schools. It is unquestionably true that wearing face coverings in class has an impact on effective communication and some students and staff will have struggled. This is particularly true for someone with speech and language difficulties or with hearing loss. However, as you will have gathered, we want to move to a hybrid model for the remaining two weeks of this half term, where a very limited amount of face covering wearing could still have a significant impact on

reducing potential transmission. Namely, moving to an expectation similar to that in the autumn term, where face masks are worn for movement in corridors and when using the toilets. These are the only times when students are likely to have any in-school contact with others in different year groups. This system would be in place for the remaining two weeks of this term and I would anticipate being able to review this rule for after the half term holiday.

Our **PE department** is working alongside SPORT ENGLAND and some other local schools on a project to provide further opportunities to our students. We will be asking our students to complete an anonymous online survey for Sport England. Attached is a letter and parent information sheet from Sheffield Hallam University, who will be collating the survey information and sending it back to school.

















Our students will complete these surveys in school, in the week after May half term, however we are giving you notice of this with a request to read the information sheet and then inform us if you do not wish for your child to participate in the survey.

**Extracurricular activities - The Music department**. Excitingly, we are now able to start running the following extracurricular activities:

- 1. Year 11 Rock Band, Tuesday, after school in M2 (repertoire: variety as chosen by the students themselves).
- 2. Year 9 Jazz Band, Wednesday, after school M2 (repertoire: Thieves in The Temple, Welcome to the Jungle, Libertango, Papa Was a Rolling Stone). We are preparing for the Autumn events. At present, year 10 and 11 members of the Jazz Band rehearse Jazz Band repertoire in their lessons as for them, this is both, their coursework and a curricular enrichment.
- 3. Year 9 Rock Choir: Tuesday and Thursday lunch times in M1 (repertoire: Kiss From The Rose and I Say A Little Prayer For You). This ensemble will hopefully soon grow to accept many Year 7, 8, 10 and 11 students who have expressed a desire to sing with us but at present, we are limited by the bubbles and the numbers that are able to participate.
- 4. Solo/duets/trios in year 7,8 and 10 bubbles are welcome to book rehearsal spaces for the forthcoming Performing Arts Showcase in the Music Block (Monday and Friday lunch times). Repertoire is chosen by students themselves.
- 5. Performing Arts Showcase. Music Auditions are scheduled on: Wednesday, 26<sup>th</sup> May and Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> June in M1, from 3:25pm until 5pm.
