Dear parents and carers

As well as the extraordinary learning in the classroom, we have seen our school burst back into life with a huge amount of extracurricular activity, including competitions, concerts, shows and numerous sporting events. Thank you to everyone who has got involved, given of their time and given of their best. These have been a really accomplished few weeks.

Charity Week. Our inaugural Charity Week was a massive success. We raised exactly £2222.00 in total! PSHE/RSE and Tutor Time/Assemblies – Development for 2022/23

We are currently working hard in school to review and develop the current PSHE/RSE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education/Relationships and Sex Education) and Tutor Time programme. This is to ensure that all our students in Year 7 to 11 from Sep 2022 onwards are provided with a enriching and in-depth curriculum experience to meet the PSHE/RSE DfE Statutory guidance with Tutor Time addressing key and important aspects of safeguarding education.

To support this we are currently auditing where these topics might be covered in other subject areas in the school; the students views on what PSHE/RSE and safeguarding topics

are the most important for the students and local community; creating a 'Personally Development Roadmap' for each year group showing what they will learn and develop in term by term through a year (PSHE/RSE topics, safeguarding topics, national focus and awareness events, etc).

This work is not just to ensure that we further develop on the current delivery and provision to be one that is outstanding and meets the needs for our students as well as meeting statutory expectations, but also one which can be shared with the local community and provide further detail and information to our parents.

So keep watching this space and more details on this will be shared through the summer term ready for Sep 2022.



Vaping Awareness

It is sad to see that nationally more young people are choosing to vape. As I am sure you are all aware it is against the law for people under the age of 18 to buy e-cigarettes (vapes) or e-liquids in the UK. Nationally it has been reported that there has been an increase in more of the disposable vape devices and also ones which do not give off clouds of smoke when used. A lot of young people seem to think it is safer than smoking, but this in incorrect. It is a fact that it will damage a young person's health and also their physical and mental development.

Having a vape on a students person or seeing a student vaping has a serious sanction at to the other local secondary schools) for example they will be issued a fixed term external

Yateley School (very similar to the other local secondary schools), for example they will be issued a fixed term external exclusion/suspension from school (which is stored and recorded on the students school file). Any vapes found on a student are also destroyed and thrown away by school staff.

We are confident at Yateley School that we do not have a vape usage issue with our students, however we are of course aware of the odd incident and small number of individuals that we have had to address with this concern. We do not want to be complacent and therefore why it is important we address the national issue and ensure our students and parents are properly educated about vapes and of course do not possess or use them.




Year 7 STEM Engineering Challenge




