### **Learning Together – Empowered for Life**

Dear Parents and carers

Reeling from torrential rain after blistering sunshine within the same week, we have been reminded just how much change is part of our lives and love it or loathe it, we have to deal with it. I have used this as a backdrop to my assemblies to years 7 through to Year 10 this week. I've suggested to them that pressure is a fact of life, but how we respond to it is largely if not exclusively a matter of choice. Much is made in the media about lost learning and young people being left 'high and dry'. There's truth in that, of course, but I have suggested that, as a school community, we can choose to control the way that we respond to this pressure and view the same thing very differently depending on whether we take a positive perspective or a negative one. Unsurprisingly for anyone who knows me — I recommended choosing a positive outlook, it generally seems to work!

I mention all of this as we've had to respond, once again, to the alteration of government guidance on national unlocking and now of course the expected day for removal of restrictions is 19 July. Although the announcement was



much anticipated, it did leave us concerned about the array of activities that we normally do in the summer term – Year 5 tasters, Year 6 transition days, Proms, celebration events etc. Quite a lot of rethinking and re-scheduling has been forced upon us and the programme of major events now looks as follows:

### Term 6 Events – Date Changes

Due to the updated announcement from the government on Monday this week delaying phase 4 until 16<sup>th</sup> July, we have made alterations to some of our plans and events for Term 6. We will be issuing a lot more detail about each event and the updated plans throughout Term 6, but for a quick summary of the changes please see below:

- Year 5 Taster Days & Evening (23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> June): These days are cancelled as face to face events and we are unable to have the Year 5 students visit the school this term. We are however working on a very exciting virtual alternative for our primary schools and Year 5 parents and students which we aim to send in the week beginning 12<sup>th</sup> July.
- Year 6 Induction Days and Evening (7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> July): These days are postponed. We are now looking to run the two days on Fri 3<sup>rd</sup> and Mon 5<sup>th</sup> Sep (therefore the school will just be open to Year 7 on these days). We are working on an alternative virtual transition programme in the meantime for our primary schools and Year 6 parents and students, which we aim to share in the week beginning 5<sup>th</sup> July. On this side of the summer holiday, we will undoubtedly look to address some of the fears and concerns that Year 6 pupils may have about coming to secondary school and make sure that they are put at ease, alongside meeting some of the key staff virtually. It's great to know that about 190 of our 220+ new Year 7s are coming to the summer school activity weeks, so this will also help with transition.
- Year 7 to 10 Celebration Evening (15<sup>th</sup> July): This event has been cancelled for this year.
- Butterfly Day (21st July): This event has been postponed. We will look to re-schedule to Term 6 (July) in 2022 (we will however still have a tutor time focus in Sep around the reasons for the event to celebrate equality and inclusivity).
- Year 13 Prom (20<sup>th</sup> July) a re-scheduled event. Further details coming from the Sixth Form team
















- Year 9 Graduation Event (22<sup>nd</sup> July): This will still be going ahead as planned with a special Year 9 assembly to congratulate students on their hard work and positive attitudes with graduating Key Stage 3 and moving into Key Stage 4, followed by fun and food on the field after lunchtime.
- Year 11 Prom (22<sup>nd</sup> July) rescheduled from 2<sup>nd</sup> July. Year 11 parents have already been notified. We are planning to run the prom normally with the opportunity for families and well-wishers to attend and view the arrival.
- Last Day Whole School Awards (23<sup>rd</sup> July): This will still be going ahead with the whole school together to celebrate student and house achievements.

The Secretary of State for Education has written a <u>LETTER</u> to secondary school parents/carers to reinforce the importance of continued vigilance over Covid safety procedures and stressing how vital it is that <u>every</u> student continues with the twice weekly LFD testing at home. I endorse this message and have made the same points to the students in assembly.
