Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you enjoyed the Bank Holiday weekend and perhaps equally important, the shorter working week! In most respects this is really welcome, although it's always tinged with caution when we've got public exams starting in a mere 5 working days. Year 11 and 13 are well set and preparing admirably for the challenges ahead and we're really proud of their attitude and endeavour. If anything, our main task is to manage anxiety and ensure them that they are



in a hugely strong position by national comparisons and are eminently capable; it's just a matter of self-belief. It is important to remember that when the last Year 11 group that sat public exams in 2019, our current Year 11s were in Year 8! They haven't benefitted from seeing exams happening all around them and seeing it as a perfectly normal part of school life.

Dr Case has been doing sterling work amongst Year 11 with our 'Excellence' initiative. This has given a significant number of students individual care and attention to detail with focused, individualised, mentoring and support. It is a demanding program designed to foster ambition

and self-belief; not settling for second best, but always aiming to reach potential. It is not just aimed at the academically gifted, but to develop great study habits, personal responsibility and deliberate practice of the actual examination questions, so that the requirements become second nature. She has written personal cards to well over 100 of the students (and continues to do so) and the well-wishes have been extremely well received!

I would like to ask for parental support please – where needed – on a traffic congestion problem in School Lane, or more specifically at the lower entrance to the site (by the Nursery/A Block). That area is not suitable for student drop-off from cars and needs to be avoided at all cost. It is a temporary car park for nursery drop off only. There have been a concerning number of cars in this area, particularly in the morning and this has already caused problems. Furthermore, it is an entrance used by hundreds of students and would seem to be 'an accident waiting to happen'. In the past I have suggested that students coming to school by car might be better dropped off further away from the school site avoiding School Lane altogether, which is very congested anyway. If it is essential to drive down School Lane at the start or end of the school day, please use the drop off area in the main carpark.





Student Star of the week this week is Ryan Hooper in 7DN. Ryan is a talented young athlete and a keen member of swimming clubs and a cycling too. He has started to enter triathlons is now performing very successfully in regional competitions (the picture shows the tri-tri event in Winchester).
