Year 11 Graduation Assembly Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup>
June & Prom Friday 1<sup>st</sup> July

**Graduation Assembly:** Next Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> June we have our Year 11 Graduation Assembly where the Year 11 tutors, house team and senior leadership team get the opportunity to say well done and good luck to our amazing Year 11 students (as well as perhaps embarrassing them and ourselves where possible!). The assembly takes place between 13.30 and 15.00 with the Year 11 students being allowed to leave

school site at 15.00. Year 11 must be in their normal school uniform for the whole of the morning on this Tuesday, however at 12.35 they will be allowed to change into their 'shirt signing' shirts and then gather on the tennis courts for lunchtime to allow them to sign each other shirts before the assembly begins at 13.30.

**Prom**: We have now made our final decisions on which students would not be allowed to attend the final Year 11 Prom based on poor attendance and/or too many behaviour points within Year 11. We have only written to the students and parents of those that are not allowed to attend, therefore if you have not received a letter then your child has met all the criteria and can attend.



#### Visible Rewards & Leadership

We have a well embedded rewards structure in the school using our house point system where by each half term we award students with various house point thresholds like tutor, bronze, silver, etc (for example please see the Term 5 awards linked to this bulletin and mentioned above). We also have a revamped student leadership and student committee structure in the school giving numerous students leadership opportunities to further support the continued development of the school in numerous areas. For some time, we have been wanting to make this more visible to all that come to the school to be able to see if students have met various house point thresholds or are members of the leadership team. Therefore, from September 2022 we are going to trial a new idea to make these rewards and leadership more visible.

Lanyards – Year 7: At the start of September 2022, we will issue all our New Year 7 students with a lanyard (the ribbon being in their house colour) which they should wear on them during the school day. It will allow them to store their lunch card, bus pass and timetable. It will however also allow them to pin to the ribbon any house point badges or student leadership badges that they might get while at the school (and by having them pinned on the lanyard ribbon means easy to take on and off each day instead of taking off their jumper like other year groups). If this works well then, we will look to rolling out the lanyards to other year groups later on.

**Badges:** We are planning to have a fresh set of house point and leadership pin badge designs from September 2022 to award to student that meet the various house point thresholds and also for those in student leadership positions. Ideas for these badges are:

**Captains** (House, Sports, Dance, Drama, Music, Charity and Community) = Rectangular badges saying the position name with the house colour as the background

**Committees** (Anti Bullying, Student Voice, Inclusivity & Diversity, Wellbeing & Welfare) = Rectangular badges saying 'Committee' with the background colour the same colour as the committee

**House Point Badges** (150 Bronze, 250 Silver, 350 Gold, 450 Half Colours, 550 Full Colours, 650+ Headteacher) = All round with the colour of the award or saying HC or FC and star shape for Headteacher.

We are currently a few percentages points under this, so please do stress with your children the importance of attendance and attending school every day and being on time. Of course, if your child is legitimately poorly then of course they need to rest

and get better. As we know a child having a perfect or very high attendance means they will be in lessons and getting the best learning experience possible which will impact positively on their future results and outcomes.

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
