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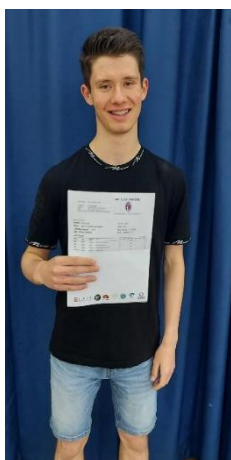
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Yateley School 2022 A-Level/BTEC/CACHE results

Yateley students are celebrating superb results in their A-level, BTEC and CACHE courses! The Sixth Form's track record has continued to be upheld and results were consequently in line with the excellent standard achieved over the past three years, and are an improvement on 2019 levels with the percentage of top grades increasing. Results of course follow a return to the normal routine of public examinations.

These fantastic results mean that Yateley students are once again exceptionally well placed to secure their choice of destinations; whether in higher education, training or employment. Each year a significant number of Yateley students progress to university, with many students heading to the most competitive degree courses.

Within a very accomplished cohort there have been outstanding individual performances. Jack Benyon is the top performer with four A* grades at A' Level; he will be reading Discrete Mathematics at University of Warwick. He is very closely followed by Sophie Green, Harry Harris, Euan Lowther-Allias and Charlie Rhodes-Peel who all achieved three A* grades.
