I am conscious that a number of the distinctive items that really identify this school and its ethos are in abeyance at the moment: tutor time, House events, extra-curricular activities, face-to-face evening events etc. We're not just accepting this as an inevitable and unavoidable consequence of the current restrictions. Many of these things are the 'glue' that holds this school together and make it so distinctive. In a measured and safe way, we are generating plans to reintroduce tutor time in a planned way for after half term and are investing in software that will enable an online parents' consultation evening platform. Similarly, with academic intervention and extra-curricular activities that can be limited to a particular year group, we are seeking to make a measured reintroduction in the next few weeks. Obviously, we won't do anything that will contravene our own safety procedures and risk assessments, but by the same token, it will offer a bit more of a glimpse of normality.

I'll finish where I started – with pride. The students have been absolutely astonishing. When I conferred with staff today after a damp and dismal Friday lunchtime, they all separately commented on how mature, co-operative and supportive the students have been. What a team!

Year 10 Elevate Education - Study Sensei - Monday 5th October

On Monday 5th October all Year 10 students will be spending Period 1 and 2 (new Lesson 1) in their tutor groups. The session is for Elevate Education to deliver a seminar called Study Sensei. The purpose of the seminar is to support them with tips and techniques in how to get the most out of their academic studies during Key Stage 4. This seminar is normally presented to Year 10 when they are all together in the main hall, but due to current restrictions, Elevate will be presenting this to the tutor groups live and online. We have been running this for many years now with positive feedback from the students.

Following the seminar students would then normally have follow on tutor sessions for 5 weeks. Because we currently are not able to run tutor time, we will be issuing these follow on sessions to student via their Show My Homework (Satchel 1) accounts each Monday (starting from 12th October).

Please can parents ensure that the students are looking at these sessions weekly and undertaking the tasks. All resources for the seminar and sessions will be shared with students via Show My Homework (Satchel 1).

Year 7 Parent and Head of House Evening – Wednesday 14th and Thursday 15th October

Each year in October we hold a Year 7 parent evening where parents and Year 7 students can come and have a meeting with their tutor and/or Head of House to see how they have settled into secondary school life. Because of the current restrictions we of course can't invite parents in like we would normally, so this year we are going to hold it online over two nights with the Heads of House. Parents will be able to book an appointment and have a 5 minute meeting with the relevant Head of House about how their son/daughter has settled in.

Wednesday 14th will be for the North tutor groups (7DN, 7NN, 7PN and 7WN) while Thursday 15th will be for the South tutor groups (7DS, 7NS, 7PS, and 7WS). Timings of the 5 minute appointments will range between 15.30 and 18.00 on both nights.

Further details of how parents can book a session and a parent user guide will be sent next week.
