<p>Trousers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Plain, black, standard school uniform style (only plain leather style belt, no “skinny”, tight-fit, jeans, cord styles). 	<p>Trousers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Year 7 to 10 = Plain navy-blue ▪ Year 11 = Plain black ▪ Standard school uniform style (no belts, studs, large zips, etc. no “skinny”, tight-fit, jeans, cord styles).
<p>Shirt</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Plain white, long-sleeved or short sleeved, buttoned with collar, tucked in at the waist. 	<p>Blouse</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Plain white, long-sleeved or short-sleeved, open neck reverse collar.
<p>Polo Shirt</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Optional (only to be worn from after May Day Bank Holiday and until the end of September). ▪ Plain white polo shirt with school name and house name on chest. 	
<p>Jumper</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Year 7 to 10 = Navy-blue uniform jumper with school badge and house name on chest, house stripe on collar. ▪ Year 11 = Plain black uniform jumper with school name initials in house colours on chest. ▪ Not to be worn with polo shirts. On hot summer days can be taken off at break and lunchtime, can be taken off in lessons with teacher permission, however must be worn when walking between lessons. 	
<p>Tie</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Blue and red striped school tie worn to a standard length. 	<p>Skirt</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Year 7 to 10 = Plain navy-blue ▪ Year 11 = Plain black ▪ Standard school uniform stitch down box pleated style at least 18 inches in length, no jersey or pencil skirts. The hem of the skirt should be no higher than 4 inches from the top of the knee.
<p>Shoes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Black, polishable, formal, low heel, plain, traditional style (no logos, trainers, boots, canvas or similar styled shoes like Vans and Converse). 	
<p>Outer Coat</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Denim jackets, “hoodies”, tracksuit tops, body warmers are not allowed. An outdoor coat with sleeves in a plain, dark colour. No obvious badges or slogans. 	
<p>Hair</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Neat style, natural colours. Extremes of hairstyle are not allowed (e.g. unnatural colours, tramlines, grade 1.5 or lower). 	
<p>Jewellery</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ No jewellery is allowed except a wristwatch; a single small plain stud in each ear. ▪ No other visible piercings, no spacers. 	
<p>Socks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Plain (black or white). 	

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School Bag <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Must be suitable for the student to fit their school equipment in for the day and at least fit an A4 book un-folded. 	
	Make-up <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A little discreet light make-up is allowed (nothing which is too visible). No nail polish, nail extensions, acrylic nails, false eyelashes, eye liner, lipstick.
	Tights <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Plain navy-blue, black or natural.

FURTHER UNIFORM GUIDANCE

Girl's Trousers

Rule of thumb when buying school uniform trousers is to avoid these words:

- 'tapered' - meaning that they will be shorter than acceptable and too tight at the ankle
- 'cropped' – they will be ankle length and therefore too short
- 'skinny' – these will be far too tight, both at the thigh, lower leg and ankle.
- 'jeggings' – basically thick leggings.

Do look for the words: tailored and bootcut.

Boy's Trousers

Not 'chino trousers, 'jean trousers' or 'combat trousers'. Typically these types of informal trousers tend to have:

- Metal studs
- Metal buttons
- Horizontal pockets
- Thick material
- and are less formal looking

Suitable trousers are generally called 'flat' or 'pleat' trousers. Typically these types of formal trousers have:

- Suit material
- Vertical pockets
- Straight-legged
- and are more formal looking

Shoes

Inevitably shoe manufacturers develop and market as school shoes, styles which circumnavigate our description of what is acceptable for our uniform i.e. introducing informal style, leather, black pumps and it can be confusing as to which are acceptable. If you are not certain based on our guidance then please do contact the school.

Sanctions Following Non-compliance with the Uniform Guidance

Skirts

Failure to comply with the required skirt length will incur a warning. If a student receives a third warning within the academic year for non-compliance, parents will be notified in writing to say that the student will be required to wear school trousers for the rest of the academic year.

Shoes

Failure to comply with the required school shoes will require the student to wear plimsolls as provide by the house centre for the day.

Hair

Not meeting our guidelines will result in a day's internal exclusion.

Persistent Refusal to Follow Guidance

Persistently refusing to follow the school uniform guidelines would result in the student being internally excluded until the matter was correctly rectified. In cases where matters are not rectified to our satisfaction we reserve the right to send a student home to dress themselves correctly for school. Where a student takes excessive time to achieve this, we would record an un-authorised absence.

Girl's skirts and trouser details: (the following sizes are kept in stock)

Girl's Trouser

- 22", 24", 25" and 26" waist – S-28" or R-30" inside leg
- 27", 28", 29", 30", 32", 34" waist – S-28", R-30" and L – 32" inside leg

Skirts

- 22", 24" waist – 18" and 20" length
- 26" waist – 18", 20" and 22" length
- 28", 30", 32", 34" waist – 18", 20" 22", 24" length






The longer lengths are much less popular and therefore not many are held in stock. For very tall, slim girls KT Textiles can source a ladies work trouser from Alexandra which is plain and similar to the school trouser (this would not be kept in stock at KT Textiles). This would be available as small as a size 6 with an XL 36" inside leg, so KT Textiles can cater for any size in trousers. These non-stocked trousers would need to be on an order only basis and dependant on stock at the time. If a parent ordered, then KT Textiles would usually get these within 3 working days if Alexandra have stock.

PE Kit Requirements

Current safety requirements that we have to follow are:

- All students must wear trainers and not plimsolls for PE and have them done up correctly. Sports trainers must be worn; this does **not** include skater/Vans/plimsoll/hi-top type trainers or, indeed anything with a flat sole with minimum grip. Students will **not** be allowed to wear footwear that does not comply with the regulations.
- Students should wear studded boots for rugby and football.
- **No jewellery** is allowed to be worn at any time during physical activity (including stud earrings). You are advised to get any ear piercings done at the start of the summer holidays so the ears have time to heal before September.
- All long hair and fringes have to be tied back off the face. This regulation applies to both boys and girls.
- It is recommended that students wear mouth guards for rugby and hockey. These can be purchased at sports shops.
- It is recommended that students wear shin pads for rugby, hockey and football. These can be purchased at sports shops.
