Yateley School 2025 GCSE results

The dedication, perseverance and ambition of Yateley School students have once again paid off, as our Year 11s celebrate another year of excellent GCSE results. These achievements mark an important milestone in their education, giving them the confidence and qualifications to take their next steps—whether that be in our thriving Sixth Form, at college, or in training pathways. We are immensely proud of our students, whose determination and commitment throughout their courses have been rewarded with success that opens doors to exciting future opportunities.



We were delighted to see extremely strong results across the cohort. Harry Findlay and Nicolas Olmos both achieved eight grade 9s and two grade 8s. Angelo Nicolae gained eight grade 9s, one grade 8 and two grade 7s and Lucie Williams scored seven grade 9s, three grade 8s and two grade 7s. Our top 10 performing students achieved 54 grade 9s between them and 109 grades 7-9!

Amongst these top performances, we are also very keen to pay tribute to those who have made greatest progress against their targets from our baseline assessments in year 7: Tymon Karas, Jack Hutchinson and Carys Jones all made over three full grades of progress in every subject above targets. As a result of the pandemic, there will be no overall Progress 8 score this year, so it is very important to recognise individuals who have made great progress across their time at Yateley School.

This year's results highlight very strong subject performance across the curriculum, with particular success in Mathematics, Physics, Geography, History, Drama, Art, Dance, Computer Science, Religious Studies, Graphics, and Food Technology. There was very strong top grade (9-7) performance in Music, French and German. The breadth of achievement across subjects reflects both the talent of our students and the dedication of our teaching staff in helping them to succeed.

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Headteacher Paul German praised the accomplishments of the Yateley School community:

“Today is a celebration of our students, and I could not be prouder of all they have achieved,” he said. “Exam results are just one measure of success, but they show the ambition, tenacity and positive spirit our young people have shown throughout their time with us. These outcomes not only reflect their hard work, but also the unwavering support of families and the commitment of our staff.”
