
The improvements have been a huge hit with the students, with one student commenting, "I cannot wait to show off our new

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

This past week, all students in Year 7 to 11 have been present in assemblies led by Mr German and Mr Keeble. One of the messages that we have delivered is around the importance of attendance and being punctual to school and all lessons. The message is simple, 'Every day/minute/second counts and school success starts with attendance'.

Regular school attendance is **essential** for all of our students to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Ideally we want all students to have an attendance figure of 100% and zero lates. We understand that sometimes there are legitimate reasons for a student to be absent which we do mark as authorised. The minimum expectation for a student at Yateley is to have an attendance figure of 96% and no lower. If there are any personal reasons why a student doesn't want to come to school they must speak to their form tutor or Head of House as soon as possible and we're here to help.

Every student at Yateley School is expected to maintain an impeccable record of attendance. It is the responsibility of everyone in our school community (parents, students, and staff) to ensure they achieve this. Each year there are **190** school days which leaves **175** days for holidays, shopping, birthday treats and non-urgent medical and dental appointments, therefore the school is very unlikely to authorise absence for any of these reasons. We ask students that they only take a day off if they are genuinely ill – and they **must** catch up with missed work when they return. Family holidays are **not** permitted during term time and all such absences will be noted as **unauthorised**.

Form tutors are made aware of their tutees attendance and lateness figures weekly and it is the responsibility of students to find out these details from their tutor. Parents should also be able to see the figures via the school gateway application on their smart device. The school will inform















parents in writing at the start of every term if there are any concerns with attendance or lateness. We will be rewarding and praising students that achieve 100% attendance each term as well as yearly, this is in addition to those students that improve their attendance throughout the year.

UNIFORM

Just a reminder to ensure that all students are meeting the uniform expectations at Yateley. Students are looking very well presented which is pleasing to see, but there has been the odd pair of trainers and nail extensions appearing here and there. Please can we remind and ask all parents to support the school in ensuring that all students are **READY** for their school day and wearing the correct uniform and having the correct equipment.


EQUIPMENT SHOP




