








YEAR 11 PARENT SEMINAR - THURSDAY 3RD OCTOBER 7PM - 8PM

STEM- visit from Airbus




If any students are interested in getting more involved in STEM this year, then they could consider becoming a STEM ambassador and get involved a range of events/activities we have on offer. This will


