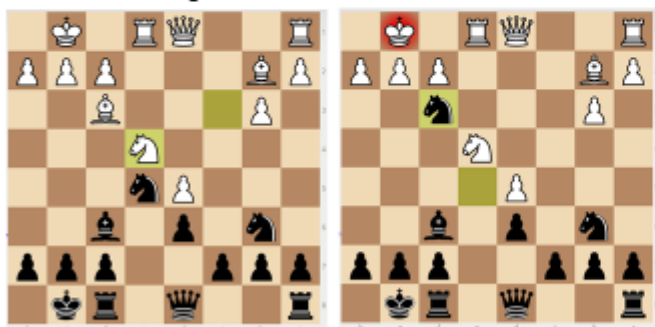

could hand them in at reception marked for the attention of Mr Donohoe." Thank you for your anticipated generosity



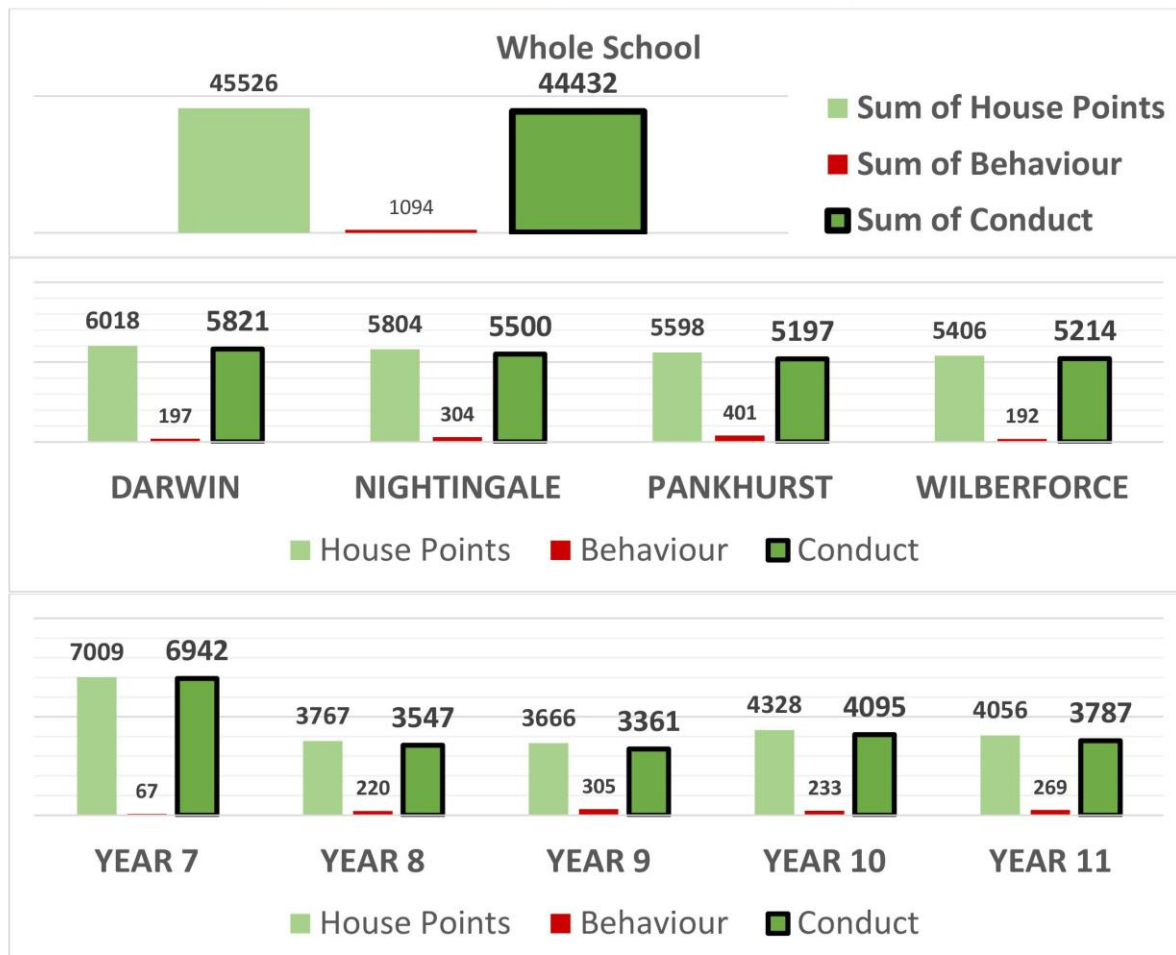
