Medical Room

If your child has sustained an injury that requires them to be on crutches this must be reported to the medical room on arrival to school as a consent form needs to be completed and then the necessary arrangements can be put in place. This would also apply if your child has sustained any other injury resulting in them requiring additional support or temporary arrangements to accommodate their injury.

We have been fortunate to become part of The Red Box Project (details below), this box will be held in the medical room.





The Red Box Project is a nationwide, community funded initiative to ensure that no young person misses school because they have their period and lack access to sanitary products.

The Red Box Project Camberley encourages individuals in the local community to get involved and donate sanitary towels, tampons and new underwear. These donations are then collected and put together into Red Boxes which are then placed into local schools. The box is accessible through an appropriate member of staff and plain bags are included in the box for discretion. Posters placed in the lavatories signpost the box, its content and location.

No tearful panics in the loo. No wadded up toilet roll. No anxious embarrassment. No missed lessons or staying at home. No missed education.



After a rigorous selection process and up against tough opposition, all 3 were selected for their respective squads. We are very proud of all of you. Good luck for the season.














































