**Library Consultation** Hampshire County Council has opened a public consultation to ask people who live, work and study in Hampshire to have their say on proposed changes to the library service. The consultation opened on 9<sup>th</sup> January and is open until Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> March 2020.

Whilst the proposals show that 10 libraries have been identified for closure and, thankfully, Yateley library is not one of them, the proposals outlined in the consultation document will impact on the opening hours of all Hampshire libraries. The library is an important and integral part of our school community and I would like to




