**Year 9 excellence.** After Christmas, we decided to have a focus on our Year 9 students and sought to reward those who were working well in their various subjects. For one week only teachers were able to give a blue card to any student they recognised to be trying hard and doing well in their lesson. At the end of the week the cards were collected and collated and letters sent home. I am delighted to report that we sent out letters for **143** Year 9 students to acknowledge that they are doing well in one or more of their subjects. I hope their Parents were as pleased to receive them as we were to send them. Well done Year 9, a spectacular achievement and thank you to Mrs James for leading this excellent initiative!

**Year 11.** I have already shared some of the excellent prospects facing our diligent Year 11 students, following strong performances in the mocks and some individually stunning results. It is perfectly clear that as well as academic excellence, we've also got a very significant number of students who are working diligently and well across the board – and this is measured in great progress scores against demanding targets whatever their starting points. We were also really pleased and grateful for the superb support received from parents,





who arrived en masse for the subject review evening on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup>. In places there were some tough messages, but for the large part the message was reassuring and encouraging the students to make best use of the next 13 weeks and supporting them to manage stress and anxiety constructively and well.

Year 11 have also had the benefit of receiving the 'ace your exams' seminar from Elevate education. As before, this was a huge hit. The students were captivated and furiously writing notes. As before, the real gains will now be made in the follow up material which will be covered in tutor time.



Debate Club A real buzz grabbed D15 after school on Thursday for the first debate club. The Year 8 and 9 students who came along all had a chance to be heard without having to shout! An ordered, but lively discussion followed on the motion of lowering the voting age to 12. Watch out Parliament! We may have found our next leaders! My thanks to Miss Robinson for getting this underway and we certainly

look to start entering regional competition shortly and also create an inter-house event.

Student Star of the week is Daniel Morgan in 11WN. Observant followers of this section will have seen Daniel's name in the prestigious position of student star of the week once before and he has been pictured in numerous bulletins. Daniel's academic endeavour and success is extraordinary and he has already shown us a glimpse of his potential at GCSE with an exemplary set of mock exam results. However, when he undertook the senior Maths challenge normally only tackled by Sixth Formers, he really came into his own. The challenge tackles the problem solving, application of principles and logic that stretches candidates well beyond the conventional exam syllabus. Daniel was in competition against very talented mathematicians in our own school and across the country – and he came top; best in school! Our sixth formers were generous in their praise and well-done Daniel.

## Mathematics Gifted and Talented



During last term a group of Sixth Form students and one Year 11 student took part in the Senior Maths Challenge run by the UK Mathematics Trust. The Senior Challenge is aimed at all 16-19 year olds studying mathematics and involves answering 25 multiple choice questions. Students in the top 40% nationally receive certificates and an opportunity to progress to further Challenges. The following students achieved a Bronze Certificate: Samuel Keys, Alex Harrison, Younes Al-Ahmad, Chloe Bradley-Turner and Joseph Harrison.
