I had the great pleasure today of presenting four of our students with certificates for very active participation in the final of Hampshire School Library Services annual literature quiz.











As some of you may already be aware, Mr Mather will be leaving us shortly from his post as Director of Sixth Form here at Yateley School. He has deservedly gained promotion and is to become Deputy Headteacher at a school in Wiltshire, so as a school we're delighted for him, but sorry to see him go. He starts his new post in part after the Easter holiday and then full-time after the May half term. In the intervening period until the end of May and in the run up to public exams, he will honour much of his teaching commitment and also be fully immersed into the induction of his successor.

Given the body of talent we have amongst the teaching staff here at Yateley School, I recruited internally for the vital post of Assistant Headteacher, Head of Sixth Form. There was considerable staff interest and after an exhaustive and taxing process I am delighted to inform you that the successful candidate is Mr Andy Conway, currently Head of English. As anyone who knows him will testify, Mr Conway is an exceptionally capable and determined teacher and leader and totally committed to the students in our school. He is highly valued by his colleagues and above all by the students. He is adamant about developing the scale and success of the Sixth Form and enabling the whole school to engage in this dynamic community; looking forward to a seven year journey right from the start aged 11.

It was clear to see through the interview process that Mr Conway is incredibly proud of our Sixth Formers; they are ambitious, aspirational, caring and a highly motivated group of young people who contribute so much to the life of the school. He cannot wait to give our students even more opportunities for success within our Sixth Form and in their future.

It was vital to me that we secured continuity in our sixth form, both for the current students and those still to come. We needed a head of sixth form with credibility, a strong track record and a vision for further success and we will have an abundance with Mr Conway. The time will come in due course to thank Mr Mather for his excellent work, but in the meantime I wanted you to be aware of this very important and exciting change in leadership.

School Footwear

We are seeing an increase in trainers being considered by some pupils as everyday footwear in the school. Please can you remind your son/daughter of what is and is not allowed.

Trainers are simply not allowed in school. Trainers can of course be used for PE lessons. I have linked below the uniform guidance which can be found on the VLE:

A recent trend are trainers called 'Nike Black Air Force 1's' (see image below). I can confirm these are not school shoes and are not allowed in school.

If needed please can you ensure you speak to your son/daughter about the uniform expectations for the school, and therefore help us to ensure students continue to follow Yateleys values of Ready, Respectful and Safe and take pride in their appearance.

If your son/daughter has a legitimate medical reason for not being able to wear school schools (and this is supported in writing to the school) then of course they will be excused from being sanctioned.





Ski Trip 2020

Despite the deadline actually having passed I have asked the Ski Company for an extension on applications. This is because we have had our resort confirmed. We will be travelling to Juwel in Austria which has over 100km of piste. I am extremely excited to be going here again so I thought opening the trip up again would only be fair. We have around 10 places still available for current year 9-12 students.

General Details Dates :	<u>Friday, 14 th February - Saturday, 22nd February 2020 (this is</u> <u>the week of the Spring half term break)</u>
Skiing:	6 days skiing with all day ski instruction and supervision.
Dry skiing:	A compulsory requirement for all beginners (Never skied on snow) on the trip. These will run after school during the autumn and spring term 2019/2020 We expect to be able to take most of the students using the school minibus.

Allocation of places:

Skiing trips are always popular. As places are limited we cannot guarantee a place for everyone who applies. The deadline for applications is 3.10pm on *Thursday 15th March.*

The trip is open to everyone in the present year 9 and above. In the event of over subscription, places will be offered firstly to sixth form students, then 2018-2019 year 11s, and then to the other two year groups. Participation in the trip is also dependent on a good behaviour record in school and if their behaviour has resulted in their removal from the trip, your deposit and any other payment will only be refunded if the school can give up the place with no financial penalty. Places for this school trip are limited and therefore in the event of oversubscription, a place will be allocated on the basis of a) meeting the deadline, this includes the submission of <u>all payments and the return of fully completed forms</u>, b) behaviour record, c)attitude to learning and attendance. If none of these apply, names will be drawn at random.

If financial hardship prevents anyone from participating in the trip, please let me know of this in writing. This information will, of course, be treated as confidential. Limited funding is sometimes available to assist in such cases.
