Dear Parents



Coronavirus I have sought to give updates as and when they become available and not to fuel the speculation which has inevitably become rife. Although the Government briefings in general terms have changed, at the time of writing there has been no significant variation in the advice given to schools and as we move into the so-termed 'delay phase' there are no immediate plans to close schools. Clearly the local determination I need to make is to ensure that there is sufficient

staffing to operate the school safely and effectively and to prioritise examination years if the situation were to become critical. In the event of partial or full closure we would maintain the online platforms and use Show My Homework primarily, but not exclusively, as a means of ensuring that work is set throughout. In the meantime, I know that many students and colleagues are avidly following the advice about good personal hygiene, in particular hand washing, and I urge parents to reinforce that advice at home. Furthermore the Government advice on identifying symptoms and responding accordingly is well known – including the need to self-isolate if necessary. The revised government bulletin issued today stated:

The symptoms are:

- A high temperature (37.8 degrees and above)
- A new, continuous cough. You do not need to call NHS 111 to stay at home

• If your symptoms worsen during your stay at home period or are no better after 7 days contact NHS 111 online at 111.nhs.uk. If you have no internet access, you should call NHS 111. For a medical emergency dial 999.

The moment I am notified of any significant change, I will notify you in writing using school comms; <u>not</u> by student message or Facebook! Please ensure also that we have up to date contact details and that your child's access to Show My Homework is functioning properly.
